Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Valley Brook Storm Sewer Replacement Project [Reinbold]

BACKGROUND:

The resident requested through her Alderperson to have this item on the agenda.

The complaint stems from our Valleybrook Storm Sewer Replacement project which replaced a failing storm sewer within easements along the side and rear of several residential properties. The project was constructed in Fall 2023.

Attached you will find the plans for the project, emails related to this issue, final letter from staff regarding the sump pump discharge, aerial views with and without floodplain, and the resident provided information. (A note regarding the emails: I put them in chronological order however, I did combine emails with multiple back and forth into 1 email so you will need to read some of these from the bottom up to follow it chronologically. A new email thread typically has a bold name and line at the top of the page. Some are repeated depending on the correspondence that followed after. I apologize for this confusion in advance.)

It should also be noted we have an outstanding punch list item with the Contractor to address the ponding water in the easement which is anticipated to be addressed in the Spring 2025. The project has not been paid in full nor has it been closed out yet. Staff agrees with the property owner that this needs to be addressed prior to closeout of the project.

As for the sump pump discharge, Staff still supports the decision made in the letter. The storm sewer was not designed for a nearly continuous flow from a sump pump whose connection was unknown to the City. In addition, the City policy is only to allow connection of sump pumps to structures so the integrity of the connection can be monitored. In this particular case, the structure has the minimum amount of concrete left between the two pipes entering the structure so a connection cannot be allowed without compromising the integrity of the structure.

The final pictures of the Aitchison's residence are located within a mapped floodplain. The City's storm sewer discharges in the same location as the replaced storm sewer. The City's project did not cause the stream to move or meander in any way. Stream meandering is a natural evolution of a stream. The City does not have jurisdiction over the stream. A stream relocation project is possible with permits from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR). However, no funds have been allocated to review this. In addition, the stream is on private property (the homeowners in Valleybrook and an outlot of the Wethersfield Subdivision). The City does not have any easements for this stream. Property owners can armor their stream banks with proper permits from the WDNR. I've attached a 1950 (pre-subdivision) and 2024 aerial showing the stream location which appears largely unchanged.



Melissa,

Good afternoon, it was a pleasure meeting with you yesterday. Below are 3 options that I believe will convey your water from your sump line to areas that will direct the water away from your house. Pros and Con to compare and consider are:

Exterior plumbing cost, interior plumbing cost, yard restoration cost, possible additional cost per city requirements.

I can Send out an official proposal once you hear back from the City and have come up with an option to proceed with. Feel free to give me a call to discuss further.

Option #1 (BETTER)

To have a plumber pipe your sump line in your basement ceiling to the front of your house. We would pipe from house to the South ditch line in front of your house.

- Depth of 4" PVC at house to daylight in ditch 2 feet
- Length of 4" PVC from house to ditch 85 feet
- Pipe Drop .30 Feet
- Pitch of 4" PVC .35% maximum flow 50GPM
- Est. Cost \$ 5,900.00

Option #2 (GOOD)

To connect to the sump line in back of your house and pipe to the Southwest ditch line in front of your house (corner of your lot).

- Depth of 4" PVC at house to daylight in ditch 3 feet
- Length of 4" PVC from house to ditch 165 feet
- Pipe Drop .92 Feet
- Pitch of 4" PVC .55% maximum flow 80GPM
- Est. Cost \$ 8,300.00

Option #3 (BEST)

To connect to the sump line in back of your house and pipe to and connect into the RCP in the city easement West of your house.

- Depth of 4" PVC at house to daylight in ditch 2 feet
- Length of 4" PVC from house to ditch 105 feet
- Pipe Drop .92 Feet
- Pitch of 4" PVC .55% maximum flow 80GPM
- ROW permits will be needed.
- City approval will be needed.
- Est. Cost \$ 6,700.00

All the above options inclusions and exclusions but not limited to the following:

Includes all spoils to remain on site; Includes spoil backfill in all areas; Includes plumbing permits; Excludes hard or soft surface restoration; Excludes ROW permits. Excludes inside plumbing work.

***Spoils trucked off site ADD \$300 per load






VALLEY BROOK STORM SEWER

Tracer wire shall be terminated at each end in a flush mount access box. Access Box shall have a cast iron lid that can be locked and opened with a standard pentagon head key wrench. Tracer wires shall be stripped and attached to stainless steel screws mounted to the underside of the lid. Sufficient slack shall be left in wire length so cover can be lifted with wire intact. Tracer wire access box shall be located directly in front of fire hydrants or where indicated on drawings and be set to grade. Tracer wire access box shall be of domestic manufacture and be equal to Valvco TWAB.





Re: Sump Pump Line

Dear Sipe Family:

We appreciate your patience while we reviewed your sump pump issue. Below are our findings.

We reviewed our records and confirmed that the old sump pump connection to the storm sewer does not appear to have been permitted. Since it was not located during the design process, it was not indicated on the plan. Once discovered by the Contractor, the City of Pewaukee (City) was notified of the illegal connection and direction was given that it may not be reconnected as there is not a structure at the location. Communication was given to the property owners by City Staff and the consultant that they may re-route the line to surface drain to the ditch or the structure, or a plumbing permit may be obtained to connect to the structure at the southwest corner of the lot (it is noted that you dispute that this communication happened). Connection of sump lines are only allowed at structures where they may be monitored and not cause damage or compromise the integrity of our infrastructure. At the time of restoration, the sump line was not redirected or daylighted by the property owner and a stone trench and stake was installed to allow the sump to discharge to the stone bedding for the storm sewer and for future location of the line for final resolution by the property owner.

The City was notified by you of your sump line backing up and that a temporary disconnection was made. The sump line is currently discharging to grade near the structure. An estimate was provided to connect the line to the storm structure in the southwest corner of the lot from the property owner. Upon further review of this structure, it has been determined that a connection to this structure will not be permitted due to the construction of the structure. At the point of the potential connection point, the minimum width of concrete exists between the storm sewers. No additional concrete may be removed between the storm sewers without compromising the integrity of the structure, and therefore connecting to the structure will not be allowed. In addition, the storm sewer was not designed to take the sump pump discharge, especially at the frequency the sump pump discharges. Allowing a connection to the pipe may result in your sump line backing up when the storm sewer pipe is full during rainfall events and immediately after. This would be a potential liability for the City if we permitted the sump discharge connection.

The City completed an additional survey on the property to determine the current grades on the property.

Some alternatives that you may consider are:

A. Redirect the discharge of the sump line to the swale along Grandview Drive on the west side of the property. This would require about 150 feet of sump line to be installed to discharge to the northwest corner of the lot.

B. The current discharge of the sump line invert elevation at the easement line is 837.40. The top of the City's storm sewer is approximately 836.70. The sump line discharge may be extended over the storm sewer so that it may discharge south over the storm sewer onto the existing wetland/ floodplain, as shown on the attached exhibit. This area drains south and southeast from the property. This will require approximately 75 feet of sump line to be installed to discharge to the southwest corner of the property. In addition, the property will be required to execute a "Statement Regarding Easement" to allow the sump discharge to be within the drainage easement. Attached is the statement if you opt for this alternative.

Regarding the ponding water and restoration issues, you are working with Rich Wirtz on the punchlist items to address this issue. An additional survey was obtained to better define the specific areas of ponding and give the Contractor guidance on repairing those areas. Once we have compiled this information, we will obtain a schedule from the Contractor to address this matter. Once we have this schedule, we will share it with all affected residents. Please note, we are trying to allow the site to dry up some so that when the Contractor does remobilize equipment to this area, he does not destroy areas that do not need to be repaired. It has been a very wet spring, so this has been a challenge for everyone involved and we appreciate your patience. This item is part of the City's contract.

As the original sump pump connection was an illegal connection, the City does not have an ordinance requiring connection of sump lines to storm sewers. And since the connection was not identified during the construction, it is our opinion that any costs associated with burying the private sump line is the property owner's. We are requesting a cost from the Contractor for Alternate B, as this is the same area that they will be addressing the ponding water issue. If we award this to the Contractor, the property owner will need to execute an agreement to reimburse the City for those expenses prior to the work being completed.

To summarize the above:

- 1. Connection to the new storm sewer pipe and the new manhole will not be allowed.
- 2. There are two alternatives to bury your sump line.
 - A. Reroute the sump line to the west and north to discharge to the swale along Grandview Drive.
 - B. Bury the sump line over the new storm sewer and surface discharge as indicated on the attached exhibit. A Statement Regarding Easement will be required to be executed and recorded at Waukesha County.
- 3. The ponding water is on our Contractor's punchlist to address. Schedule to be determined.



- (2) Owner agrees that in the event the City must damage or destroy the sump line or any part thereof in connection with the construction, maintenance, or operation of public drainage facilities located within the Easement Area, Owner agrees that the City will not be responsible for the cost of repairs to, maintenance of, or replacement of the sump line or other features placed within the easement area.
- (3) Owner agrees to not connect to the City owned storm sewer pipe and manhole now or in the future. If future repair or replacement is required to the sump line, Owner must notify the City in writing prior to completion of the repair within the drainage easement.
- (4) This Statement is to run with the land and will benefit and burden owner and the City, and their respective successors and assigns.







Our concerns are regarding the Valley Brook Storm Sewer Project that was done in the Summer/Fall of 2023.

We received a letter from the Department of Public Works dated July 13, 2023 stating that the project was going to be done and that there would be various contractors bidding on the project as well the homeowners needing to move any obstructions on the easement, which we took care of in a timely manner.

We received a second letter dated September 8, 2023 from Public Works stating that Musson Brothers would be doing the project and the work was set to begin September 18, 2023 and an approximate timeline for the project.

The third and final letter we received was dated October 4, 2023 for Public Works reminding homewowners to remove personal items for the easement and a reminder of the timeline.

These 3 letters have been the only formal communication we have received from the city.

My husband and I are home all day and n one ever came to our door to tell us how things

were going or if they ran into problems. We heard yelling when they began digging in our backyard and went out to investigate. We asked what happened and were told that they cut the sump pump pipe. When we asked them, what was going to happen to fix that "we were told you will hear from the city." No one from the city ever contacted us. There were wooden stakes that were pounded into the ground as "a placement marker to show where the sump pump pipe was" and left there during the entire project. Every time I asked about the stakes, I was told, "you will hear from the city". When my husband asked Rueckert-Mielke about the sump pump, he asked my husband if we got an "email from the city". We never heard from the city.

When the project was completed and they came to lay soil and seed the area, they knocked over a tree in our backyard (with the skid steer) and threw it in our woods. I came out to ask them what had happened and was told, "I didnt mean to" and he was very unprofessional. They did remove the tree from the woods after I asked them why they threw it back there. I asked them about the stakes in our backyard and was told that I needed to ask the city. So I called Brian Leightner (whose name is on the bottom of the letters we received) on November 7th. He told me to send him pictures of the stakes and the trees. Brian responded via email on November 14th. His response was that I could pull out the stakes as they "were just placeholders". He told me they put gravel where the pipe was cut and that "it will be fine". I questioned him on it and was told it will be fine. He said that the tree was on the easement, so there is nothing they can do.

March 5th at 4:00 am we woke up to a loud thumping sound and water coming into our basement. My husband quickly rerouted the sump pump to above ground. He called the city at 8:30am on March 5th and spoke to Rich Wirtz and explained what happened. Rich told him that the sump pump cannot be connected to the drain sewer and the city completed a dry well since they had not heard from us. He suggested we call a plumber to route the discharge to the junction box. He also suggested we could use a pop up emitter for sump pump discharge. My husband explained that we were very disappointed with the lack of communication as we were always being told we will hear from the city for a solution. He also told RIch that the grading on the easement is not correct. We have pooling water in our backyard. They moved the problem from the front yard (standing water in the ditch) to our backyard, which wasn't a problem before this project began. Rich stated that the water problem will be fixed and the contractor will not be paid till it's corrected.

Melissa called our plumber on March 5th and he came out to access. He told us it's going to cost thousands of dollars to rip our yard back up and bury a pipe to the junction box. We are not paying thousands of dollars for something that worked fine until the city started digging. If the city would have formally came forward and presented us with options, we would have worked with them to get it fixed. It would have made much more sense to run pipe while the yard was all ripped up. Our plumber also stated that a dry well isnt going to work based on the amount of water our sump pump pumps out. Our pump runs every 30 seconds regardless of rain or season. He said a pop up emitter will not work because it will freeze and the amount of water discharged will still create standing water. So who authorized cutting the pipe and creating a dry well?

Melissa called Rich back on March 5th, after meeting with the plumber, and he returned

my call that same afternoon. I explained to Rich about how frustrated we were in this whole process and that how we are getting no communication or help from the city. He directed me to call Maggie Wagner. I called her and left a voicemail on March 5th at 2:30pm.

Maggie returned my call on March 6th and I explained to her what I explained to Rich. -who called us? Show me an email or letter? We went outside multiple times and were told we are waiting on the city.

- -we dont even know what they hooked up and how, just had stakes in the yard
- -our backyard is a lot worse, sump pump is draining on easement and has standing water.
- -why is the catch basin (junction box) dry as a bone?

I will be sending a second email with picture attachments of our backyard.

Attached please find the daily report from 10/17/2023 which shows that Kurt discussed the sump pump/drain tile with the resident. We received direction from the City that if a resident would want to connect their sump lines to the storm sewer, they would have to get a plumbing permit to do so.

Kurt also dropped off notifications to all of the residents regarding the drain tile reconnections and need to go through the plumbing department. He said that when he dropped off the notifications, he also talked to each resident about this. I have not been able to find a copy of the notification, is it possible that the City prepared this, and we delivered them?

After no inquiries/requests were received, we directed the contractor to create a stone sump for the line to drain in to. I have not been able to find any records of if this information was relayed back to the resident.

I appreciate your patience while I reviewed your sump pump issue. Below is my findings so far. I am still investigating a few ideas but am waiting for some information to come back before I may finalize our analysis.

The records provided by the consultant indicate he did contact property owners during the construction. I understand that you dispute this and have noted it.

We reviewed our records and confirmed that the old sump pump connection to the storm sewer does not appear to have been permitted. Since it was not located during the design process, it was not indicated on the plan. Once discovered by the contactor, the City was notified of the illegal connection and direction was given that it may not be reconnected as there is not a structure at the location. Communication was given to the property owners by City Staff and the consultant that they may re-route the line to surface drain to the ditch or the structure, or a plumbing permit may be obtained to connect to the structure at the southwest corner of the lot. Connection of sump lines are only allowed at structures where they may be monitored and not cause damage or compromise the integrity of our infrastructure. At the time of restoration, the sump line was not redirected or daylighted by the property owner and a stone trench and stake was installed to allow the sump to discharge to the stone bedding for the storm sewer and for future location of the line for final resolution by the property owner.

The City was notified by you of your sump line backing up and that a temporary disconnection was made. The sump line is currently discharging to grade. An estimate was provided to connect the line to the storm structure in the southwest corner of the lot from the property owner. Upon further review of this structure, it has been determined that a connection to this structure will not be permitted due to the construction of the structure. At the point of the potential connection point, the minimum width of concrete exists between the storm sewers. No additional concrete may be removed between the storm sewers without compromising the integrity of the structure and therefore connecting to the structure will not be allowed.

Some alternatives that you may consider to date are:

- 1. Redirect the discharge of the sump line to the front ditch on the west side of the property. This would require about 150 feet of sump line to be installed to discharge to the northwest corner of the lot.
- 2. The current discharge of the sump line invert elevation at the easement line is 837.40. The top of the City's storm sewer is approximately 836.70. The sump line discharge may be extended over the storm sewer so that it may discharge south over the storm sewer onto the existing wetland/floodplain. This area drains south and southeast from the property.

In regards to the ponding water and restoration issues, I understand you are working with Rich Wirtz on the punchlist items to address this issue. This is ongoing and we are working to obtain a schedule from the contractor to address this matter. Once we have this information, we will share it with all affected residents. Please note, we are trying to allow the site to dry up some so when the contractor does re-mobilize equipment to this area that he does not destroy areas that do not need to be repaired. It has been a very wet Spring so this has been a challenge for everyone involved and we appreciate your patience.

Once I receive the additional information I have requested, I will finalize our analysis and alternatives.




Ms Wagner,

Yes, we did have rain, but as I have said before, we never had any standing water in our backyard until this project.

Ms. Wagner,

Thank you for your email. I have been trying to contact you frequently over the last few weeks. I'm sure you can understand my sense of urgency as I have 3 children (one who is quite small). We have not been able to fully utilize our backyard this Spring because of the long pipe that we were told to lay down to re-route our sump pump to the junction box. This has resulted in very tall grass. We now have to be very cautious of ticks, which I'm sure you have heard, are bad this season. My husband is not able to mow the grass properly because of the pipe. He cannot move it to mow because our sump pump, like I have said previously, runs every 30 seconds.

I know that when we first spoke in March, I shared with you the fact that no one contacted us. We have all the documentations (letters that were written) from the City in relation to this project. We do not have any letter stating that our sump pump was disconnected and options given to us going forward. If we had, we would have worked with the City to fix the problem while our yard was ripped up last Fall during this project. Each time that I went out to ask a worker about our sump pump, we were told that we would hear from the City. You stated in your email that communication was given to us by City staff. Who communicated this

information to us? When and how was it communicated? We weren't even made aware that the City was waiting on us to make a decision. Again, no one contacted us. We had a large stake in our yard after restoration was done. When I asked the workers about it, they said that I would hear from the City. After not hearing anything, I called Brian in November and was told that a drywell was put in place. He did not mention that it was there because we, as property owners, didn't contact anyone. When I questioned him on the amount of water going into the drywell and if this option would be sufficient, he told me "it will be fine." It was not fine on March 5- when we woke up in the middle of the night to a loud thumping sound and water in our basement.

We have done what you recommended. My plumber has been out here several times and has put us in contact with a sewer company to give us the estimate you requested. Now, we are being told that your recommendation is not acceptable. We are not able to do your first alternative. We cannot reroute our sump line to the front as we have various obstacles (trees, landscaping, well pump) in the line that would need to be dug up to get it to the front. I'm not sure I understand your 2- alternative. Do you mean that we should bury it over the sewer pipe and into the woods? Won't that area always be wet and mushy?

In regards to the ponding water, we have been in contact with Rich and are awaiting a reply. We understand that weather can be an issue, but the rest of our yard is solid. We realize you need to work with the contractor. I appreciate you letting us know that you are waiting to hear from them and then will update us. Again, I'm sure you understand our frustration and urgency with this. We would just like to enjoy our yard as a family as we did before this project began.



I received the below response from Matt Zander from Musson regarding the sump pump line extension for Valleybrook.

Musson's revised price for this work is \$6,727.46. I did some quick math and the cost makes sense IF the work were to take 8 hours to complete. However, the extension of the sump pump line is about 60-feet and should be reasonably expected to be completed in 2-3 hours.

My assumption is that they are trying to recover the cost of the additional filling/restoration that is needed in the low spots in the easement. One option is to ask that this work gets completed on a time and materials basis and track the work associated to the sump pump line closely.

The sump line should likely also have a rodent guard at the end. Spoil backfill is okay, but can you please confirm that the pipe would have stone bedding and cover?

I have attached Pay Application No. 2 with the quantities as discussed in the email below with the exception of the restoration quantity.

For the restoration, we have a total quantity measured of 2,406 SY. I apologize for my delay in getting back to you on this. I visited the site last Thursday and have included photos in the link below. As I mentioned earlier this year, there are low areas in the easement that pond water and do not allow the restoration to grow. After reviewing the photos taken shortly after the erosion mat was placed, it appears as though these areas were always low. The attached survey mark-up shows these areas. These areas will need to be filled with additional topsoil and restoration to get positive drainage away from the low spots.

The City has also been in discussion with the resident at N39W22711 Grandview Drive regarding their 4" PVC sump line discharge pipe. This line was previously connected to the existing storm sewer. As part of the project, the pipe was backfilled with stone and not reconnected to the new storm sewer. Since then, the resident has extended a corrugated pipe which discharges into the manhole. Can you please provide a price to extend the buried sump line approximately 62-feet to the southwest to discharge at grade at a trail opening at the tree line as shown on the survey mark-up?

We have the following comments regarding the submitted Pay Application/Quantities:

- 1. Bid Item No. 3, Tracking Pad The requested quantity is 630 SF. We have a recorded quantity of 15'x35' which equals 525 SF. I have included a photo of when the tracking pad was being installed in the link above. The photo shows the stone being installed on the geotextile fabric. Typically, the roles of the geotextile are 15-feet wide. It appears as though additional stone was installed wider than the geotextile fabric that was installed. For this reason, we are sticking with the quantity of 525 SF as it was recorded in the field.
- 2. Bid Item No. 7, Clearing and Grubbing The recently requested quantity is 388 SY. In the attached email correspondence, Interstate Tree requested 385 SY. After review of their quantities and ours, I am in agreement with 385 SY.
- 3. Bid Item No. 9, Tree Removal The recently requested quantity is 74 ID. In the attached email correspondence, Interstate Tree requested 58 ID. After review of their quantities and ours, I am in agreement with 58 ID. There was a 6" diameter tree identified on the plans. - 6. Bid Item No. 18, Topsoil, Seed Fertilizer & Erosion Mat The requested quantity is 2,493 SY. We have a recorded total quantity of 2,406 SY. I have attached a marked-up exhibit showing this area.



The last correspondence we had was the letter outlining your options (attached). As I outlined in the letter, the connection of the sump to the storm sewer will not be allowed. Since sump lines are not required to be buried by the City, it would be the properties responsibility to bury the line either to the right of way along the street or over our storm sewer in the easement discharging to grade with an agreement. Since I received no further communication from you, we pursued only completing the punchlist items with the contractor including the restoration and the ponding water issues.

The cost estimate we received from the contractor to complete option 2B as part of the punchlist work was \$6,727.46 which was not authorized.





Partial Chapter 5 - Parking Regulations Draver Parking Rogowski Parking Stutzman Parking (b) Violations Prohibited. When official traffic control devices giving notice of the restrictions, prohibitions and limitations shown on the Official Traffic Map are erected and maintained in accordance with the provisions of this section a violation of the restriction, prohibition or limitation shown on the Official Traffic Map shall be a violation of the provisions of this code. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to require that all signs be shown on the Official Traffic Map, or to exempt compliance with applicable laws in the event the actual signage is not reflected in the Official Traffic Map.

- (c) Map to be Maintained. A copy of the Official Traffic Map shall be maintained and displayed in the office of the City Clerk.
- (d) Additions to Map. The Common Council may from time to time make additions to or deletions from the Official Traffic Map by resolution and the City Engineer or designated representative shall keep such Official Traffic Map current.
- (e) Nothing herein shall be interpreted to restrict the locations where signs may be placed to only those places depicted on the Official Traffic Map. Signs shall be erected in such locations and manner as to give adequate warning to users of the street, alley or highway in question.
- (4) Prohibited Signs and Markers in Highways. No person, other than an officer authorized by this Code to erect and maintain official traffic control devices or his or her designee, shall place within the limits of any street or highway maintained by the community any sign, signal, marker, mark or monument unless permission is first obtained from the Public Works Department or State Highway Commission. Any sign, signal, marker, mark or monument placed or maintained in violation of this subsection shall be subject to removal as provided in Section 5.03, Subsection 5.
- (5) Removal of Unofficial Signs, Markers, Signals and Traffic Control Devices. The Public Works Department may remove any sign, signal, marking or other device which is placed, maintained or displayed in violation of this Code or state law. Any charge imposed against premises for removal of a prohibited or illegal sign, signal, marking or device shall be reported by the Police Chief to the City Common Council for review and certification at its next regular meeting following the imposition of the charge. Any charge not paid on or before the next succeeding November 15 shall be placed upon the tax roll for collection as other special municipal charge.
- (6) Vehicles must Stop. It shall be unlawful in the City of Pewaukee for the operator of any vehicle, and every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, to fail to come to a full and complete stop within thirty (30) feet of the main limits of the intersection, at which has been erected an "official stop sign" or traffic signal, designating an artery for through traffic.

 - 1. Within the driving lane.
 - 2. Alongside another vehicle properly parked along such highway.
 - 3. On a sidewalk or sidewalk area.
 - 4. Alongside or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction, when such stopping would obstruct traffic or when pedestrian traffic would be required to travel in the roadway.
 - 5. Upon any portion of highway where and at the time when stopping or standing is prohibited by official traffic signs indicating the prohibition of any stopping or standing.
 - 6. No truck, tractor, trailer, or semi trailer as defined by Section 340.01 vehicle code definition (73) (71) and (57) W.S.A. shall be parked on any residential street between the hours of 2:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. on any day of the week.
 - (b) Stop or leave standing any vehicle in any of the following places except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading or in receiving or discharging passengers and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may promptly be moved in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic:
 - 1. In a loading zone.
 - 2. Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant, unless a greater distance is indicated by an official traffic sign.
 - 3. Within four (4) feet of the entrance to any alley or private driveway.
 - 4. Closer than thirty (30) feet to the driveway entrance to a fire station.
 - 5. Upon any portion of a highway where and at the time when parking is prohibited, limited or restricted by official traffic signs.
 - 6. With the wheels more than twelve (12) inches from the curb.
 - 7. Closer than two (2) feet to a vehicle parked to the front or rear.
 - 8. Upon any portion of a highway any vehicle displayed for sale.
 - 9. Without the permission of the owner or lessee of any public or private property, contrary to a posted sign thereon, if there is in plain view on such property a "No Parking" sign or a sign indicating limited or restricted parking.
 - (c) Stop or leave standing any vehicle which in any way blocks the entrance to any private driveway or garage, without the consent of the owner of said driveway, so as to prevent free passage of vehicles.

(d) Stop or leave standing any vehicle on a street in such a manner as to obstruct the free flow of traffic. Any such obstruction shall constitute an emergency condition detrimental to the health, safety, welfare, and good order of the general public in that the movement of food, fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health and police protection is impaired, as provided for in Section 66.325(2) of the Wis. Stats., and said vehicle may, at the direction of a law enforcement officer, be removed by the City or its representative after first attempting to give notice to the owner of said vehicle that the same must be removed. It shall be unlawful in the City of Pewaukee for the owner, person, firm, partnership or corporation nor any officer, member, agent, servant, employee of any firm, partnership or corporation or operator of any vehicle or any device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway to park, stop, leave standing, or suffer any such vehicle or devise at the curb, shoulder, or edge or any highway area, roadway or fire lane in the City of Pewaukee during the months of November, December, January, February and March of each year.
- (6) Other "Parking" Limitations.
 - (a) Open parking of automobiles accessory to a residential use shall be limited to no more than those actually owned or leased by the residents. Temporary parking of guests shall be permitted, not to exceed three (3) days. In the event the owner of the premises requires parking for additional automobiles, the owner may make application to the City of Pewaukee on forms provided by the City and if good cause is shown for the need for additional vehicle parking other than allowed herein a permit will be issued on a yearly basis. Law enforcement officers for the City shall administer the provisions of this paragraph. (Rep. & Recr. 09-21)
 - (b) No trucks, commercial trailers, mobile homes, camping trailers, campers, buses, or other vehicles not commonly known of as an automobile shall be parked on a lot in any district except where permitted as a use in an industrial or commercial district, as hereinafter provided or as follows:
 - 1. Parking of agricultural equipment shall be permitted without limitation where accessory to a permitted agricultural use.
 - 2. Parking of one panel or pickup truck on the owner's premises shall be permitted in any district.
 - 3. Unenclosed parking of no more than one mobile home, camper home, camping trailer or camper on an occupied residential lot where the length of said vehicle is twenty-four (24) feet or less (excluding therefrom the length of the trailer's tongue) shall be permitted in any district and only when the vehicle is actually owned or leased by the resident. All other vehicles other than trucks and commercial trailers prohibited in this Code shall be permitted to temporarily park on a residential lot for no more than three (3) consecutive or ten (10) cumulative days in any twelve (12) month period. Those vehicles described above longer than twenty-four (24) feet in length (excluding tongue or draw-bar) may be permitted for longer periods of time by special permission of the City Common Council. Applicant shall make application for longer parking of those

vehicles by filing with the City Clerk a sketch of his lot, the location of the proposed unit to be parked, the location of his neighbor's buildings. The City Common Council, after recommendation of the Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator and after on-site observation, may grant a yearly parking permit to those units described herein where it appears that the parking of that mobile home, camper home, camping trailer or camper in excess of twenty-four (24) feet in length will not be an eyesore, nuisance or hazard to any adjoining properties or to the residential neighborhood in which it shall exist. No such vehicle units may be used as living quarters.

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- 4. Parking of trucks and commercial trailers shall be permitted in those districts where not permitted as a use only when making deliveries or pickups to the building where parked and then only during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and, only while actually making said delivery or pickup. The temporary, overnight parking of truck-tractors may be permitted in a residential zoning district when the owner/operator of the truck-trailer is being temporarily parked, and the City law enforcement office is duly notified of the time(s) in advance of such overnight parking. For the purposes of this Code, "temporary, overnight parking" is defined as not more than one continuous twenty-four (24) hour period twice a month. (Rep. & Recr. 09-21)
- (7) Registration record of vehicle as evidence. When any vehicle is found upon a street or highway in violation of any provision of this code regulating the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles and the identity of the operator cannot be determined, the owner as shown by the ownership registration of the vehicle supplied by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, or a comparable authority of any other State, shall be deemed to have committed the violation for purposes of enforcement of this Code and shall be subject to the applicable forfeiture penalty; provided the defenses defined and described in Section 346.485(5)(b), Wis. Stats., shall be a defense for an owner charged with such violation. (Renumbered 09-21)

5.05 VEHICULAR WEIGHT LIMITATIONS. (Rep. & Rec. 10-15)

The City's Highway Superintendent (or Director of Public Works) shall have the authority to impose special or seasonal weight limits to prevent injury to the roadway of any highway, bridge or culvert within the jurisdiction of the City or for the safety of users of such highway, bridge or culvert and shall be responsible for erecting signs giving notice thereof in accordance with § 349.16, Wis Stats

Good morning, Alderman Rich Reinbold,

I am writing regarding the current parking restrictions in Pewaukee.

We have lived in Woodleaf Reserve for about 4 years, and bought our house in part due to the spacious gathering areas and yard. In December, not a flake of snow to be found, and no other cars parked on the street, we had a Sunday afternoon gathering with 40 guests. Our guests and myself were approached by a sheriff's deputy to move all of the cars off the street or be ticketed.

Many of my guests left at that time, others squeezed into our driveway. I think we can have a better policy than restricting parking 100%. I was also informed that the police chief required notification prior to a gathering.

Christmas Day I had guests at my house. Contacted the police chief where I was asked the number of cars, the time of our gathering. The individual took the request to the police chief and got back to me with his decision.

I would think that with an updated winter parking policy, that the police chief could spend his time focusing on more important issues.

Many reasonable options are available- perhaps a combination of some of the following: no parking 2-6 am

alternate side parking - the cars are allowed to park on the side of the street that aligns with the date (even day, even side of the street for parking)

snow emergency - parking restricted for snowfalls over 2 inches to allow plows space to work until roads are cleared

Typically, the driveways are able to accommodate guests, it is unreasonable to allow no street parking at all.

I am urging the common council to update their policy.

Good morning Gentlemen:

I'm writing regarding the upcoming meeting at which the current City of Pewaukee parking restrictions are to be discussed. While I'm unable to attend, I wanted to share my insights on the subject. I have been a resident in the Woodleaf Reserve subdivision for almost eight years. Most of us have no need for street parking, on a daily basis, since driveways and garages are normally enough for residents and their vehicles. That being said, my wife and I built the home we did, with a larger living area, specifically for family gatherings. We have a larger-than-average family (possibly still growing), celebrate birthdays, Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc., and struggle to play "musical cars" on the driveway during these family celebrations. I'm sure you can see it would be uncomfortable to ask some family members not to attend, or to "carpool" with others, "because we don't have room on the driveway." The current Pewaukee restrictions seem quite excessive with NO street parking (even in front of my own house) for a full FIVE months (almost have of the year).

My wife and I previously lived in Oak Creek for 35 years, and never had an issue with street parking. In Oak Creek, their winter parking restrictions are: <u>Dec.1 - Mar. 31 with no parking Mon-Fri from 2am-6am and Sat & Sun from 2:30am-6am.</u> Exceptions may be granted (on a day-to-day basis) during emergencies, if a vehicle becomes disabled, or if there is an overnight guest. Residents can contact the police dept. to gain such permission."

I think we could agree that a policy similar to this sounds both reasonable and doable. Hope these insights can help to promote a solution that is acceptable to all.

BACKGROUND:

As directed by the Common Council, a draft ordinance for allowing ATV/UTV's to operate in a specific area of the community was drafted. The Ad-hoc committee recommended an ordinance. The City Attorney reviewed the ordinance and created a version of the proposed ordinance. There are substantial changes from the Committee recommendations. If the Council wants to proceed with the ordinance, I recommend sending the ordinance back to the Committee for review of the Attorney revisions.

Also attached are emails that were sent to Staff from residents in the affected area. A summary phone log from phone calls to Staff is also included.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The City will be required to install route signage. Signs are estimated at \$45 each and post is approximately \$45 each. If we just post the perimeter of the limits, we will need approximately 12 signs. Total supply cost is estimated at \$2,000 plus labor. It should be noted that we did not budget for this additional signage in our current budgets. If the ordinance is approved, we will seek additional funding to cover this expense from contingency funds.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

If Council would like to move this ordinance forward, I recommend sending it back to Committee to review the City Attorney recommendations.

ORDINANCE NO	
An Ordinance Creating Chapter Vehicles of the Code	Relating to All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility Terrain of Ordinances of the City of Pewaukee

WHEREAS, the City of Pewaukee recognizes that surrounding communities permit the use of non-traditional vehicles, including all-terrain vehicles and utility terrain vehicles, on their roadways; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pewaukee recognizes that there is interest in allowing the use of such vehicles on roadways within a set boundary in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pewaukee also recognizes that such use, if permitted, requires appropriate regulation to ensure the safety of all citizens; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stats. § 23.33 authorizes municipalities to designate municipal roads as all-terrain vehicle routes to allow all-terrain vehicles and utility terrain vehicles to operate on certain roads within the municipal boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Common Council of the City of Pewaukee, Waukesha County, Wisconsin do ordain as follows:

Chapter	Traffic and Vehicles, Article	, Section	of the City Municipa
Code is hereby repeal	ed and recreated to read as follows:		

All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility Terrain Vehicles

Section I – Authority

The Common Council of the City of Pewaukee adopts the provisions of this Ordinance pursuant to the authority of § 23.33 and § 62.XX, Wis. Stats., to regulate, control, prevent and enforce certain uses, activities, and operations by persons that may affect all-terrain use and traffic in the City of Pewaukee, and has the power to designate all-terrain routes and trails by § 23.33, Wis. Stats, all terrain and utility terrain vehicle speed limits under Wis. Stats § 349.11(11), and regulations under Wis. Admin Code Chapter NR 64.

Section II – Regulation of All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV and UTV)

Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Ordinance, the statutory provisions of Wis. Stats. § 23.33, Wis. Stats. § 340, Wis. Admin. Code NR § 64, describing and defining regulations with respect to all-terrain vehicles are adopted and by reference made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute or administrative code incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this Ordinance. Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of the statutes of administrative code incorporated herein are intended to be made part of this Code in order to secure uniform statewide regulation of all-terrain vehicles.

Section III – Designation and Authorization of ATV Routes

Except as otherwise specifically provided in Wis. Stats. § 23.33, and subject to the conditions and limitations hereinafter set forth:

- (a) Designated Routes. All maintained roads, streets, and highways in an area designed as north of Prospect Avenue (CTH SS), west of Prospect Avenue (CTH G) and south and east of Pewaukee Lake specifically excluding Prospect Avenue (CTH SS and CTH G), with a speed limit as posted, will be designated as ATV Routes in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8)(b)(2).
- (b) Temporary Closure or Suspension of ATV Routes. The City Engineer, at his or her discretion, shall have the authority to temporarily close or suspend operation of ATVs and UTVs on any road, street, or highway on an ATV Route designated or authorized herein for a period of ninety (90) days or less due to hazard, construction, or emergency conditions.
- (c) Permanent Closure of ATV Routes. The Common Council may permanently restrict operation of ATVs and UTVs on any ATV Routes designated or authorized herein at any time, for any reason, through removal of route signage and by providing notice to the public.
- (d) Annual Review of Ordinance. The Common Council shall review this ordinance annually. Said review shall include a report from the Public Works Department regarding highway damage. In addition, the Sheriff Department shall give a report on ATV and UTV violations, crashes, and safety concerns.

Section IV – Signage

All ATV Routes shall be signed in accordance with Wis. Stats. § 23.33 and Wis. Admin. Code NR § 64.12(7).

- (a) The City of Pewaukee Public Works Department shall have the sole responsibility for ATV/UTV signage on City roads, streets, and highways. The Public Works Department shall coordinate the installation of any signage required on State or County highways with the respective agency that maintains jurisdiction of each segment of highway authorized or designated as an ATV Route.
- (b) All signs shall be in compliance with the most current version of the Wisconsin Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- (c) No sign shall be mounted to an existing County sign post unless authorized by the Waukesha County Highway Commissioner or designee.
- (d) No sign shall be mounted to an existing Wisconsin Department of Transportation sign post.
- (e) ATV and UTV operation shall be subject to all provisions of Wis. Stats. § 23.33, which is adopted as part of this ordinance by reference. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8)(f), no person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking ATV Routes:
 - (1) Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign, if the sign is legally placed by the state, any municipality, or any authorized individual.

(2) Possess any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign of the type established by the Department of Natural Resources for the warning, instruction, or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.

Section V – Operation of All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility Terrain Vehicles on Designated and Authorized ATV Routes

- (a) Conditions and Restrictions on ATV and UTV Operation. The operations of an ATV or UTV on a roadway that is a designated or authorized ATV Route and signed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8)(e) by the City of Pewaukee shall be subject to all provisions of Wis. Stats. § 23.33, Wis. Stats. § 340, and Wis. Admin. Code NR § 64, which are adopted as part of this ordinance by reference. In addition, the following conditions and restrictions shall apply to all ATV and UTV operators and passengers, as applicable:
 - (1) On all designated and authorized ATV Routes that are roadways shared with another jurisdiction, the more restrictive Ordinance shall apply.
 - (2) Allowed only from November 1st to March 31st annually. Operation outside this window is prohibited on all designated and authorized ATV Routes.
 - (3) ATVs and UTVs shall not be operated at a speed greater than the posted speed limit, except that no ATV or UTV may be operated at a speed greater than 25 miles per hour. An operator of an ATV or UTV shall slow his or her vehicle to a speed not to exceed 10 miles per hour and yield the right-of-way when traveling within 100 feet of a person who is not on an ATV or UTV, a snowmobile or a motorcycle except as provided under Wis. Stats. Chapter 346, where applicable.
 - (4) ATV and UTV operators shall comply with all applicable rules of the road governing motorized vehicles operating on municipal roadways in accordance with Wis. Stats. 23.33 and Wis. Stats. Chapter 346 and all other applicable traffic and parking laws, local ordinances, and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources regulations.
 - (5) No persons under the age of sixteen (16) and no persons without a valid driver's license may operate an ATV or UTV on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City.
 - (6) All ATV and UTV operators born after January 1, 1988 are required to have an ATV Safety Certificate and it must be carried at all times while operating the ATV and UTV.
 - (7) No person may operate or be a passenger on an ATV or UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required in Wis. Stat. § 347.485(1)(a) and with a chin strap properly fastened, unless the person is at least eighteen (18) years of age, the person is being transported for medical reasons while under the care of emergency personnel, or the person is an emergency responder who is responding to an emergency that is directly related to the function of a city, town, village, county, state agency, federal agency, federally recognized American Indian tribe, or public safety corporation.

- (8) All ATV and UTV operators shall ride in single file on the extreme right-hand side of the paved portion of the roadway, unless otherwise marked for operation on the shoulder or in the right-of-way. Left turns may be made from any part of the road or highway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- (9) All ATVs and UTVs shall have fully functional headlights, tail lights, and brake lights while operating on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City. Every ATV and UTV operator on any highway must display a lighted headlight and taillight at all times.
- (10) Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to change direction if the ATV or UTV is not equipped with turn signals.
- (11) No person may drive or operate an ATV or UTV while under the influence of alcohol or a restricted controlled substance, including absolute sobriety by operators under the age of twenty-one (21).
- (12) Open intoxicants are prohibited for ATV and UTV operators or passengers while the ATV or UTV is in operation in the City.
- (13) No person shall drive or operate an ATV or UTV on any designated or authorized ATV Route between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.
- (14) Operation of an ATV or UTV within any municipal park is prohibited, with the exception of designated driving lanes and parking areas.
- (15) Operation of an ATV or UTV on any sidewalk, designated bicycle or pedestrian lane, gravel shoulder, ditch, or other area of any public right-of-way other than on the paved roadway is prohibited, unless specifically designated and posted otherwise by the City.
- (16) No person shall leave or allow any ATV or UTV owned or operated by that person to remain unattended on any public highway or public property.
- (17) Studded tires or track ATV or UTV are not allowed on any designated or authorized route.
- (18) If seatbelts are available on the ATV or UTV, they must be worn by all operators and passengers.
- (19) A golf cart is not an ATV or UTV. Operation of golf carts on City roads is prohibited.

(b) Licensing, Insurance, and Registration.

- (1) *Driver's License*. Persons sixteen (16) years of age or older must possess a valid driver's license to operate an ATV or UTV on a designated or authorized ATV Route in the City.
- (2) Insurance. No person may operate an ATV or UTV on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City unless the owner or operator has in effect a liability insurance policy providing coverage consistent with the liability insurance required for operation of a motorized vehicle by the State of Wisconsin and has in his or her immediate possession proof that he or she is in compliance.

(3) Registration. All ATVs and UTVs shall be registered for public use in accordance with Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources regulations with proof of registration displayed as required by statute during all times of operation.

(c) Disturbing the Peace and Nuisance Activities.

- (1) Exhaust System/Muffler Modifications Prohibited. Every ATV and UTV shall be equipped, maintained, and operated to prevent excessive or unusual noise in accordance with all applicable provisions in Wis. Stat § 23.33(6m). No person shall operate an ATV or UTV on a designated or authorized ATV Route unless such ATV or UTV is equipped with a muffler or other noise suppression system in good working order and in constant operation. It shall be unlawful to use a muffler cutout, bypass, or similar device on any ATV or UTV in a manner such that noise is emitted by the ATV or UTV increases to a level higher than as originally manufactured.
- (2) Radios, Sound Systems, and Electronic Sound Amplification Devices. ATVs and UTVs equipped with radios, sound systems, or electronic sound amplification devices must be operated at a volume that is limited to within the personal space of the vehicle, unless the electronic sound amplification device is being used to request assistance or to warn against an unsafe condition.
- (3) Cruising Prohibited. No ATV or UTV operator shall engage in the practice of cruising on any authorized or designated ATV Route in the City. Cruising is defined as running all or part of the length of a roadway multiple times per day, back and forth, for any purpose other than departing or arriving at their residence or place of lodging or departing or arriving at a public boat launch.

Section VI – Enforcement and Penalties

- (a) Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(12), any state traffic patrol officer under Wis. Stat. § 110.07(1), inspector under Wis. Stat. § 110.07(3), conservation warden appointed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources under Wis. Stats. § 23.10, county sheriff, or municipal peace officer shall have authority and jurisdiction to enforce this Ordinance.
- (b) No operator of any ATV or UTV may refuse to stop after being requested to do so by a law enforcement officer or a conservation warden.
- (c) Penalties related to violations of this Ordinance as set forth in Wis. Stats. § 23.33(13), are incorporated herein by reference.

Section VII – City Immunity from Liability

- (a) ATV/UTV operation is at the risk of the operator and any passenger(s). In establishing ATV Routes under this Ordinance for recreational use, the City of Pewaukee intends to utilize the liability and immunity protections provided under Wis. Stats. § 895.52. provided, however, that the City does not waive any other liability exemption(s) and/or limitation(s) afforded the City under Wisconsin law.
- (b) Designation of segments of the City highway system as ATV Routes does not impose upon the City of Pewaukee Public Works Department a greater duty of care or responsibility for maintenance of those segments than for any other segment of City highway. Operators of

ATVs and UTVs on City highways assume all the usual and normal risks of ATV and UTV operation.

Section VIII - City Clerk to Provide Required Notices

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(11)(b), following adoption, the City Clerk shall provide copies of this Ordinance to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Wisconsin State Patrol, and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office.

Section IX - Severability

The several sections of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the Ordinance. The remainder of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

Stats. Chapter 346, where applicable.
 - (4) ATV and UTV operators shall comply with all applicable rules of the road governing motorized vehicles operating on municipal roadways in accordance with Wis. Stats. 23.33 and Wis. Stats. Chapter 346 and all other applicable traffic and parking laws, local ordinances, and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources regulations.
 - (5) No persons under the age of sixteen (16) and no persons without a valid driver's license may operate an ATV or UTV on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City.
 - (6) All ATV and UTV operators born after January 1, 1988 are required to have an ATV Safety Certificate and it must be carried at all times while operating the ATV and UTV.
 - (7) No person may operate or be a passenger on an ATV or UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required in Wis. Stat. § 347.485(1)(a) and with a chin strap properly fastened, unless the person is at least eighteen (18) years of age, the person is being transported for medical reasons while under the care of emergency personnel, or the person is an emergency responder who is responding to an emergency that is directly related to the function of a city, town, village, county, state agency, federal agency, federally recognized American Indian tribe, or public safety corporation.

- (8) All ATV and UTV operators shall ride in single file on the extreme right-hand side of the paved portion of the roadway, unless otherwise marked for operation on the shoulder or in the right-of-way. Left turns may be made from any part of the road or highway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- (9) All ATVs and UTVs shall have fully functional headlights, tail lights, and brake lights while operating on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City. Every ATV and UTV operator on any highway must display a lighted headlight and taillight at all times.
- (10) Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to change direction if the ATV or UTV is not equipped with turn signals.
- (11) No person may drive or operate an ATV or UTV while under the influence of alcohol or a restricted controlled substance, including absolute sobriety by operators under the age of twenty-one (21).
- (12) Open intoxicants are prohibited for ATV and UTV operators or passengers while the ATV or UTV is in operation in the City.
- (13) No person shall drive or operate an ATV or UTV on any designated or authorized ATV Route between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.
- (14) Operation of an ATV or UTV within any municipal park is prohibited, with the exception of designated driving lanes and parking areas.
- (15) Operation of an ATV or UTV on any sidewalk, designated bicycle or pedestrian lane, gravel shoulder, ditch, or other area of any public right-of-way other than on the paved roadway is prohibited, unless specifically designated and posted otherwise by the City, subject to any exceptions to this rule as identified in Wis. Stat. § 23.33.
- (16) No person shall leave or allow any ATV or UTV owned or operated by that person to remain unattended on any public highway or public property.
- (17) Track ATV or UTV are not allowed on any designated or authorized route, except as noted in Wis. Stat. §23.33(6)(g).
- (18) If seatbelts are available on aUTV, they must be worn by all operators and passengers.
- (19) A golf cart is not an ATV or UTV. Operation of golf carts on City roads is prohibited.

(b) <u>Licensing, Insurance, and Registration</u>.

- (1) *Driver's License*. Persons sixteen (16) years of age or older must possess a valid driver's license to operate an ATV or UTV on a designated or authorized ATV Route in the City.
- (2) Insurance. No person may operate an ATV or UTV on designated or authorized ATV Routes in the City unless the owner or operator has in effect a liability insurance policy providing coverage consistent with the liability insurance required for operation of a motorized vehicle by the State of Wisconsin and has in his or her immediate possession proof that he or she is in compliance.

(3) Registration. All ATVs and UTVs shall be registered for public use in accordance with Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources regulations with proof of registration displayed as required by statute during all times of operation, subject to the exceptions as listed in Wis. Stat. § 23.33(2).

(c) <u>Disturbing the Peace and Nuisance Activities.</u>

- (1) Exhaust System/Muffler Modifications Prohibited. Every ATV and UTV shall be equipped, maintained, and operated to prevent excessive or unusual noise in accordance with all applicable provisions in Wis. Stat § 23.33(6m). No person shall operate an ATV or UTV on a designated or authorized ATV Route unless such ATV or UTV is equipped with a muffler or other noise suppression system in good working order and in constant operation. It shall be unlawful to use a muffler cutout, bypass, or similar device on any ATV or UTV in a manner such that noise is emitted by the ATV or UTV increases to a level higher than as originally manufactured.
- (2) Radios, Sound Systems, and Electronic Sound Amplification Devices. ATVs and UTVs equipped with radios, sound systems, or electronic sound amplification devices must be operated at a volume that is limited to within the personal space of the vehicle, unless the electronic sound amplification device is being used to request assistance or to warn against an unsafe condition.
- (3) Cruising Prohibited. No ATV or UTV operator shall engage in the practice of cruising on any authorized or designated ATV Route in the City. Cruising is defined as running all or part of the length of a roadway multiple times per day, back and forth, for any purpose other than departing or arriving at their residence or place of lodging or departing or arriving at a public boat launch.

Section VI – Enforcement and Penalties

- (a) Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(12), any state traffic patrol officer under Wis. Stat. § 110.07(1), inspector under Wis. Stat. § 110.07(3), conservation warden appointed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources under Wis. Stats. § 23.10, county sheriff, or municipal peace officer shall have authority and jurisdiction to enforce this Ordinance.
- (b) No operator of any ATV or UTV may refuse to stop after being requested to do so by a law enforcement officer or a conservation warden.
- (c) Penalties related to violations of this Ordinance as set forth in Wis. Stats. § 23.33(13), are incorporated herein by reference.

Section VII – City Immunity from Liability

(a) ATV/UTV operation is at the risk of the operator and any passenger(s). In establishing ATV Routes under this Ordinance for recreational use, the City of Pewaukee intends to utilize the liability and immunity protections provided under Wis. Stats. § 895.52. provided, however, that the City does not waive any other liability exemption(s) and/or limitation(s) afforded the City under Wisconsin law.

(b) Designation of segments of the City highway system as ATV Routes does not impose upon the City of Pewaukee Public Works Department a greater duty of care or responsibility for maintenance of those segments than for any other segment of City highway. Operators of ATVs and UTVs on City highways assume all the usual and normal risks of ATV and UTV operation.

Section VIII - City Clerk to Provide Required Notices

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(11)(b), following adoption, the City Clerk shall provide copies of this Ordinance to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Wisconsin State Patrol, and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office.

Section IX - Severability

The several sections of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the Ordinance. The remainder of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

Thank you for the note concerning the proposed ATV/UTV ordinance for use on our City streets.

My wife Stephanie & I have lived in Pewaukee since 1992. We lived on Peninsula Drive until 2002, then on Rocky Point until present. I personally have been visiting the area since my aunt & uncle lived on Woodland in the 60's & 70's. All of our time has been spent within the targeted area of this ordinance for 6 decades.

We are <u>against</u> the proposed ATV/UTV ordinance. Use of these vehicles within our streets and neighborhoods will cause more congestion, more noise and more damage to yards. All-terrain describes exactly what these vehicles do – move off roads.

We walk the exact targeted roads EVERY day with our dogs. So do dozens of other walkers we see daily. With all the construction that has transpired yearly, there is already a tremendous amount of traffic to contend with just to safely transit the streets. ATV/UTV's will make this experience more difficult, less safe and less enjoyable.

We already contend with traffic on Milwaukee Avenue, and with drivers using our driveways and our yards to turn around in. How is ATV/UTV use going to make living in Pewaukee any better for taxpayers who will be subject to the whims of these drivers – 5:00am to 11:00pm? We assume ATV/UTV users will try to use this street and our property for access points to the lake. Will this force us to erect a fence on our property and driveways to maintain some privacy?

Further, I am originally from Woodruff and visit my Mom regularly. We have watched how the ATV/UTV use up north has caused some of the issues with the same concerns I have previously listed. Being rural, there are fewer people to impact. Yet even there, it changes the way of life from where you walk, when you walk, where you hunt and the dust, debris and damage from all-terrain vehicles.

Acceptance of this ordinance will also almost certainly reduce property values for when owners go to sell their properties.

An ordinance like this will increase use of the vehicles on the Lake. With the tragic death of the gentleman this past week, and our winters being less strong forming thinner ice, there is a mathematical certainty that more of these tragedies will occur due to more use of ATV/UTV's.

I will be traveling February 17th and cannot be present for this meeting. However, if any of you wish to speak to me before the meeting, I would be happy to talk with you about our concerns. You could even take a walk with us and our dog and see the neighborhoods up close yourself. Please consider this letter two votes from City residents against this proposed ordinance.

Dear Alderpersons Tabbert and Brown,

Thank you for the informational letter describing the proposed ATV/UTV area that will affect our neighborhood. After reading the description of the ordinance, including the streets involved and the timing during the year, we realize that it is possibly intended to provide ice fishermen and others access to the lake with their vehicles. We are opposed to the proposal for three primary reasons. The first is safety concerns for pedestrians, the second is the noise and lastly enforcement.

We are dog walkers and on a daily basis, walk our two Border Collies from our home on Rocky Point Road through the affected neighborhoods. Our usual route takes us along Oak St, Woodland Dr, Miami Dr, Peterson Dr, and then back home essentially along the same streets. There are no sidewalks along our route so we walk along the edge of the streets. We feel that the increased motor vehicle activity will decrease the safety of our walks.

The second concern is the noise produced by ATVs and UTVs. In our experience, these vehicles are much louder than automobiles and pickup trucks. Unlike automobiles, they also tend to ride in groups when being used for recreational riding. This magnifies the noise levels. We know this to be true first hand because our cottage in Northern Wisconsin's Oneida county lies on a road that is a designated ATV/UTV route. These vehicles are heard long before and after they are seen traveling past our property.

Lastly, we feel that enforcement of the rules of the proposed ordinance will be challenging for our police officers to oversee. Preventing speeding or after hours riding, for instance, will be nearly impossible without a police presence in the area regularly. Using our police officers' time patrolling the area for violators, taking officers away from other more important duties, is an unnecessary waste of our tax dollars.

We are not opposed to the local neighborhood residents using the roads to take their ATV/UTV from their homes directly out onto the lake for ice fishing. But this proposal will allow both local residents and non-resident ATV/UTV owners access to our roads for recreational driving. For these reasons, we are strongly opposed to the proposal.

I'm not sure how this proposed ordinance allowing ATVs on city streets particularly in densely populated neighborhoods with higher value homes is a good idea. ATVs are built for off-road, not urban environments. This ordinance would effectively create a state ATV trail on streets within our area. It's odd that the first sentence of the ordinance tries to justify this by alleging surrounding communities permit this so evidently this must be an okay thing to do in Pewaukee?

It's folly to believe that ATVs will slowly, quietly follow each other single file to the far right of the streets of our neighborhoods. The ordinance recognizes the likely main objection to the proposal by including a "Disturbing the Peace and Nuisance Activities" section. The section is poorly worded and the enforcement of any of the provisions is highly unlikely. ATVs by their very nature and with the type of engines they have are not quiet vehicles. I live on the lake and experience it first hand. The manufacturers noise level is loud, it's part of the allure. Because they are louder, riders crank up sound systems not to be obnoxious, they simply can't hear the music over the engine noise. To believe that sound will be limited to within the personal space of the vehicle is just not realistic. The cruising section attempts to alleviate concerns that ATVs will be allowed to aimlessly driven around but is ambiguous enough to prevent nothing of the sort and even if it could, how would it even be controlled. It seems to try and limit non resident activity but allows residents to clearly engage in "cruising" as long as they arrive and depart from their residence?

This ordinance adds very little upside and more detriment to the enjoyment of the majority of residents in the area and should be rejected. And if it is deemed to be beneficial for this area why isn't it beneficial to Five Fields, SteepleChase, Deer Haven and other neighborhoods in the city? Please share my concerns with the rest of the Common Council.

Good evening Mayor and City Council members,

I'm writing you in SUPPORT of the ATV/UTV route ordinance. Here are several reasons I feel should be considered in your decision.

- 1. Many towns, villages and cities in northern and central Wisconsin have already approved ATV/UTV routes on roads and highways.
 - a. Locally, many of our bordering communities have passed ATV routes already, with many others going through the process.
 - b. If so many communities are doing this, successfully, without issue, why shouldn't Pewaukee be able to do the same?
- 2. ATVs have been using the roadways for years, with very minimal issues. Having an ordinance only helps solidify rules and safety expectations.
- 3. Many times ice conditions get bad quickly, and forcing permanent shack owners to take trucks out to retrieve them is a big safety concern being able to use an ATV to get shacks off promotes a safer option. I would hope we want to promote safety.
- 4. This is a great thing for local businesses and restaurants during the ice fishing season, generating more business for our small business community.
- 5. If you've been around the launches, roads and parking lots are filled with trucks/trailers because ATV users have to transport their ATVs to avoid driving them on the roads on/around the lake. Allowing access will significantly reduce parking congestion.
- 6. I've heard grumblings that ATVs are "too loud". Motorcycles and big diesel trucks are just as loud if not louder, yet we allows those on our streets, so not a very good argument in my opinion.
- 7. Enjoying recreational vehicles is a great family activity. Being able to access the roadways surrounding the lake allows for families to enjoy the lake and spend time together. I see so many kids out there

- having a great time with their dad or mom, I would hope as a community we would want to have activities that allow families to enjoy our lake and their time together as a family.
- 8. There is zero financial impact to the City (that I'm aware of) in approving this. If anything, it financially benefits our community as noted above in #4. If there is a need for producing ATV route signage and installing signage, I'm happy to volunteer my time to help raise funds for signs and get them installed I don't think any of our supporters are looking for the City to fund a dime to help with this.

I'm not pleased that our tax dollars are being used by the DNR to sit in their trucks at the launches, ticketing people for simply driving ATVs. The DNR should better utilize their time and resources to actually patrol the lakes and ensure people are complying with fishing regulations and ensuring lake owners properly mark their hazardous/unsafe aerators. If the DNR is removed from ticketing ATVs using the roadway they will be forced to better utilize their time protecting the fishery and ensuring safety.

In closing, I know there are people that are not in favor of this (though I've yet to hear a valid argument or one that couldn't be addressed through regulations/laws within the ordinance), and to those individuals, I hope they bring forward their concerns so that you are able to design rules and regulations to address those concerns while still approving the ordinance - I believe both sides can get what they want.

Good afternoon Mayor and City Council members,

I am unable to attend tonight's Common Council meeting but would like to express my support of a reasonable ATV/UTV route on Pewaukee streets around Pewaukee Lake. Pewaukee Lake is a busy place in winter and safe access is very important to ice fishermen, ice boaters, recreation vehicle users, etc. Moving ice shanties and ice boat trailers, along with accessing remote areas of the lake is much safer with an ATV. Ice thickness can vary greatly, especially this year, and risking driving full size trucks on the ice always poses safety concerns. Parking at launches can be difficult especially when the police hand out street parking tickets. Allowing ATV/UTV's to use the local streets reduces parking issues especially if the users live close to the lake. It also opens opportunities like parking trailers at Netteshiem park and driving ATV/UTV's to the Smokey's public launch.

Allowing ATV's on local streets is very common in Northern and Central Wisconsin. It is part of the community. Easier access brings tourists in, which brings more customers to local bars, restaurants, gas stations, and businesses. Pewaukee Lake is known for the walleye and crappie night bite which is not on every lake. Fishermen travel to fish this lake because of this. They bring business to Curly's Waterfront, Mugshotz, The Beer Depot, and the BP gas station bait shop. Allowing the use of ATV's on streets reduces parking congestion which in turn makes this lake and it's launches more desirable.

DNR has been using their time to sit at the launch and hand tickets out to ATV operators instead of getting out on the ice to ensure fishing laws are being followed which in turn keeps the fish population healthy and safe. A much better use of the tax dollars going towards DNR enforcement is helping the environment, not being a traffic cop.

Noise and speed should not be a concern, Harley's ripping down the road in summer are significantly louder and completely legal. Speed should be regulated like any other automobile. I ask that you consider the benefits of creating ATV routes and appreciate your time.

This memo is in reference to the bid opening for the Pewaukee Inclusive Playscape & Splashpad project that took place Thursday February 13, 2025 at 3:00 PM.

We have reviewed the six bids received and found them all to be complete. **Level UP Construction, Inc.** submitted the low bid of \$494,630.01 for the base bid and \$35,906.00 for the alternate bid (trail connection) for a total bid amount of \$530,536.01. Bids ranged from \$494,630 to \$929,013 for the base bid scope. Level UP has built several similar projects recently for us and is qualified for this project. We have recent working project experience with them, confidence in their abilities as well as their sub-contractors to perform the project scope, and we have verified the scope of work and assumptions with them via phone call.

Our opinion of probable cost for the base bid project was \$520,263.50 and \$35,775 for the alternate for a total of \$556,038.50. The received bid was below our OPC by 4.5% and is favorable to the city. It would be typical to carry a 10% contingency in case of any unforeseen situations or sub-surface conditions that require additional effort. The unit pricing submitted appears to be reasonable for current industry standards. After reviewing the bid and discussions with the contractor, it is our opinion that the city should accept the base bid and alternate bid from Level UP as received. The alternate bid scope will finish an important link to the south parking lot and provide the last piece of pathway connectivity within this area of the park. With the favorable pricing and timing of this project, it is in the best interest of the city to complete the work now.
