ORDINANCE NO. 24-18

ORDINANCE TO FIX AND ESTABLISH THE AMOUNT OF SALARIES, WAGES AND ALLOWANCES WHICH SHALL BE PAID BY THE CITY OF PEWAUKEE TO ITS NON-UNION EMPLOYEES

The Common Council of the City of Pewaukee does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Beginning January 1, 2025, and every two weeks thereafter, the annual, biweekly, and hourly rates of the elected and appointed officials of the City of Pewaukee, and certain special allowances to be paid, are hereby fixed at the following rates:

SECTION 2. The amounts herein before specified shall be the salaries and wages in full per year, per bi-weekly, per hour, or as specified, for the various officials and employees, subject to the following:

MILEAGE: Reimbursement for mileage shall be paid to all employees who are authorized by their department head/supervisor to use their personal vehicles for city purposes, and who do not currently receive a monthly/ quarterly car allowance. Reimbursement shall be made at the current federal rate, for actual mileage incurred. A Mileage Reimbursement form shall be filed with the City Clerk on a monthly basis for all reimbursement requests before any such payment shall be made.

The Mayor will receive an annual mileage stipend of \$1,350.00 and each Common Council Members will receive an annual mileage stipend of \$800.00.

SECTION 3. Employees shall be covered under the State of Wisconsin Retirement System ("WRS") effective January 1, 2011. The City will pay the employer contribution to the WRS as required by law, which effective January 1, 2025 is 6.95% for general employees and 15.02% for protected service employees.

SECTION 4. Effective January 1, 2013, all non-union employees opting to participate in the City's health, dental and/or vision insurance plans, shall contribute fifteen (15%) percent towards their monthly health, dental and vision insurance premium costs via payroll deduction on a biweekly basis. If the employee (and spouse where applicable) participates in the City's wellness program, benefited non-union employees may qualify for health insurance premium discounts as outlined in the City's wellness plan.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall not be printed or published as part of the Pewaukee Municipal Code.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect beginning January 1, 2025.

SECTION 1. Beginning January 1, 2025, and every two weeks thereafter, and beginning July 1, 2025, and every two weeks thereafter, the hourly rates of the union employees of the City of Pewaukee, and certain special allowances to be paid, are hereby fixed at the following rates:

Reimbursement shall be made at the current per mile reimbursement rate in effect for the State of Wisconsin employees, for actual mileage incurred. A Mileage Reimbursement form shall be filed with the City Clerk on a monthly basis for all reimbursement requests before any such payment shall be made.

SECTION 3. Employees shall be covered under the State of Wisconsin Retirement System ("WRS") effective January 1, 2011. The City will pay the employer contribution to the WRS as outlined in Acts 10 and 32, which effective January 1, 2025 is 15.02% for protective services.

SECTION 4. Effective January 1, 2013, all benefited union employees opting to participate in the City's health, dental and/or vision insurance plans shall contribute fifteen (15%) percent towards their monthly health, dental and vision insurance premium costs via payroll deduction on a biweekly basis. If the employee (and spouse where applicable) participates in the City's wellness program, benefited union employees may qualify for health insurance premium discounts as outlined in the City's wellness plan.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall not be printed or published as part of the Pewaukee Municipal Code.

As outlined in the Municipal Code, Reserve Capacity Assessments (RCA) are area assessment being served by the reserve capacity of the system. Additionally special assessments may be levied against properties for sanitary sewer or water infrastructure. A detailed fee schedule for RCS and other special assessments is available from the Water/Sewer Utility.

IX. STORM WATER UTILITY

As outlined in the Municipal Code, the City has adopted a Storm Water Utility for the entire City. Properties with at least 267 square feet of impervious surface are subject to an annual Storm Water Utility Fee of \$120.00 per Equivalent Runoff Unit.

Esteemed Mayor and City Alderpersons:

Greetings from the Village of Butler! I greatly appreciate the opportunity to come before you today to request the sale and transfer of one of your reserve "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor Licenses.

As you may know, the State of Wisconsin has not increased the allowable number of "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor Licenses a municipality can possess since 1997 when the new quota system came into effect. This quota system left the Village with 3 regular "Class B" licenses and 2 reserve "Class B" licenses, all of which are currently taken by active establishments in the Village.

This has begun to hurt the Village as two new establishments have opened up along Hampton Avenue (one restaurant and one event space) and have reached out to Administrative Staff stating that the lack of available intoxicating liquor licenses is hurting their businesses.

Because of this, I reached out to nearby municipalities who would likely have a fair number of reserve licenses to see if they would be willing to consider transferring one of their licenses to Butler to help one of our local businesses. Your municipality responded and stated it would consider transferring one of these licenses to the Village at an upcoming meeting.

If the Council agrees to the transfer, the city would see a one-time payment of \$10,000 come from the business owner, payable to you through the Village of Butler. The Village would then retain possession of that license until otherwise transferred.

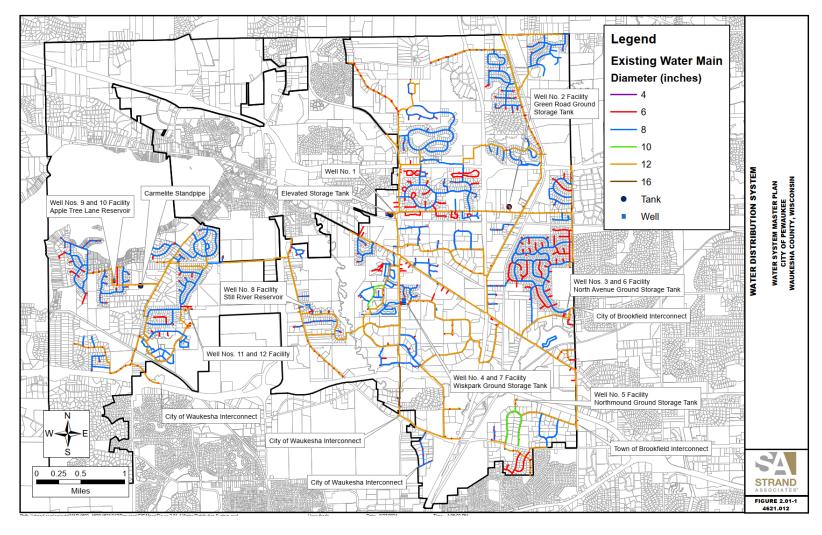

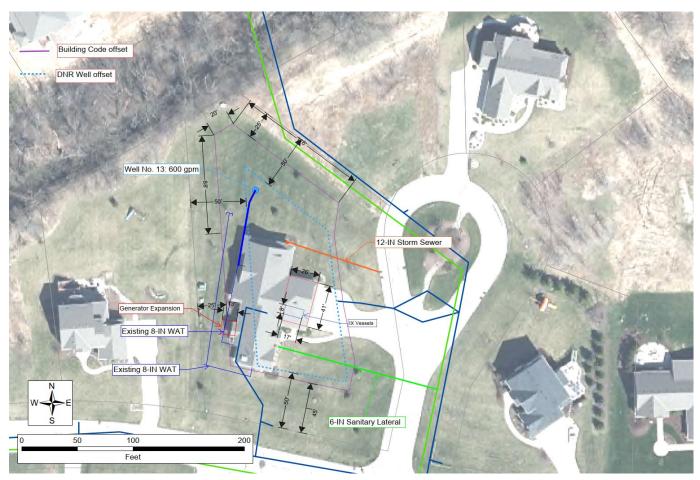

Still River site plan

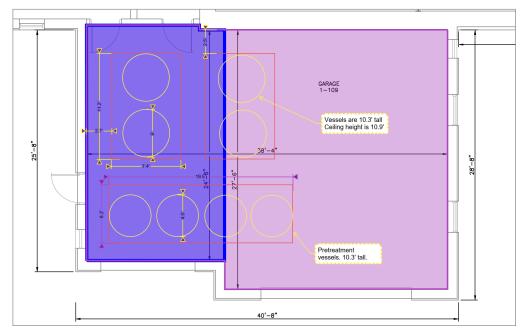

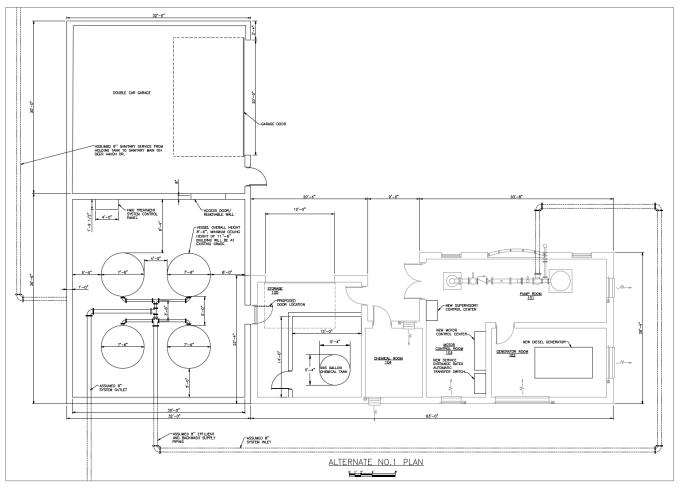


Example Ion Exchange Treatment Vessel Layout in Existing Garage

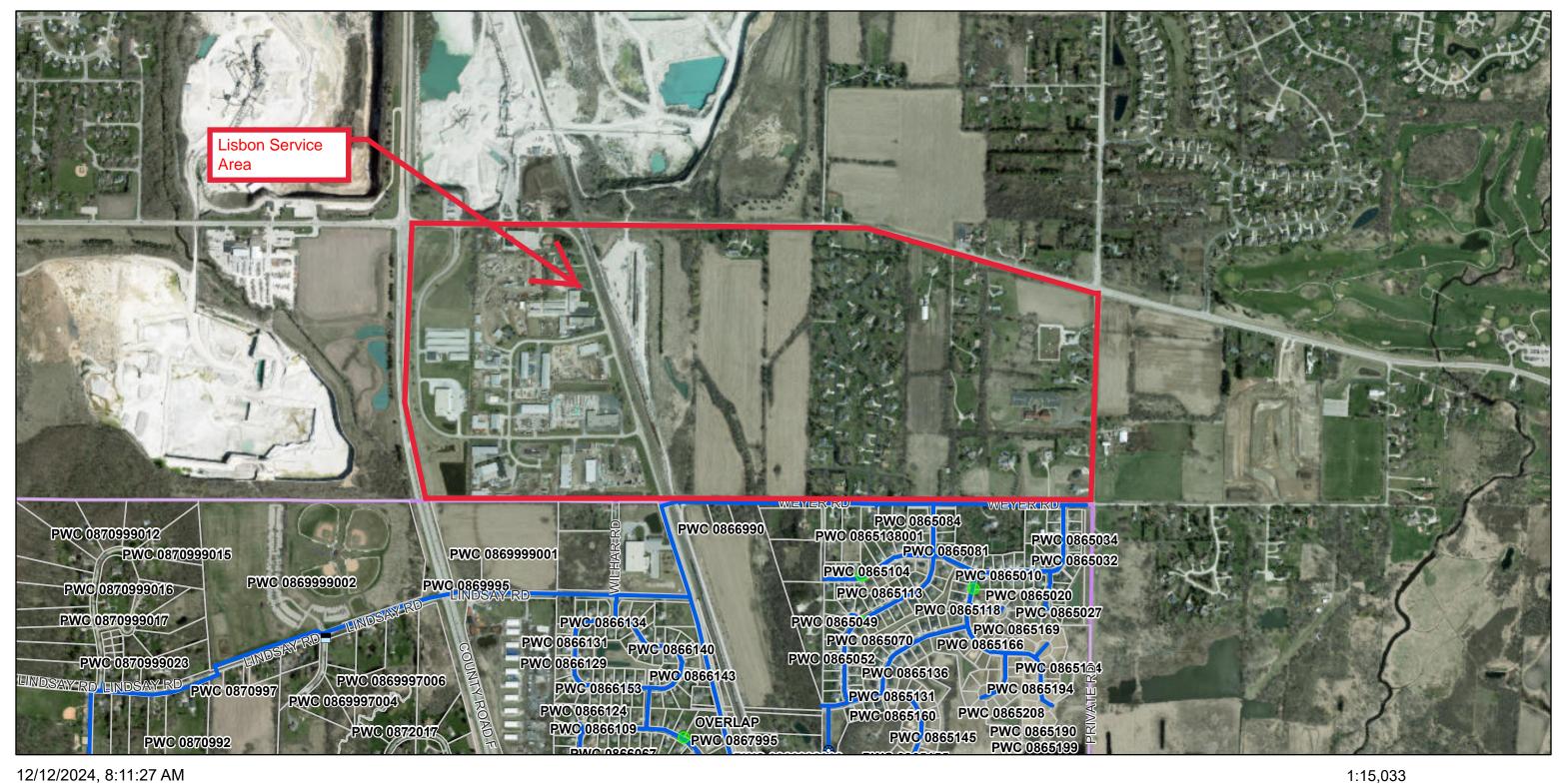

INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PEWAUKEE AND VILLAGE OF LISBON FOR THE WATER SERVICE ANALYSIS

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this _____ day of _____, 2025 by and between Village of Lisbon, a Municipal Corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin with principal offices at W234N8676 Woodside Road, Lisbon, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the "Village" and the City of Pewaukee, a Municipal Corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin with principal offices at W240 N3065 Pewaukee Road, Pewaukee, Wisconsin, hereinafter called the "City," is as follows:

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, The Village of Lisbon is requesting municipal water service to an area of the Village as part of a well relief plan as outlined in Exhibit ____ called the "Area", and

WHEREAS, the City has municipal water service near the Area serving existing City of Pewaukee properties, and

WHEREAS, to determine whether the City can extend municipal water service to the Village, the City must determine what, if any additional improvements are required to facilitate the treatment and transport and capacity requirements for supply of safe drinking water, and

WHEREAS, the City has requested a proposal from Strand Associates, Inc. to analyze the foregoing and evaluate the projected water use for this Area, the City's ability to transport the water at required minimum pressures, the current and future capacities, and treatment requirements (the "Technical Review"), and

WHEREAS, the Village agrees to pay for the City's costs of the Technical Review, and

WHEREAS, in the event municipal water service is extended to the Village all water infrastructure will be owned and operated by the City to be provided by the City to the Area, and the water service shall be only of the type and nature presently being provided to the City, and

WHEREAS, the initial estimate of the cost of the Technical Review is \$5,900, and

WHEREAS, in the event the City, in its sole discretion, after consideration of the Technical Review agrees to extend municipal water service to the Village, the Village acknowledges that further testing, review and administration shall create further costs to the City. An Intergovernmental Service Agreement between the Village and the City shall be required which will address all issues, including these additional legal, engineering, administrative costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed:

1. The Village shall pay to the City all costs (currently estimated to be \$5,900) upon presentation of an invoice to pay the costs of the aforementioned Strand Associates capacity studies and related costs, so that the City's review of the request may proceed.

THIS AGREEMENT shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns, or such public board's committees, commissions or entities as shall succeed substantially to the rights, powers, and duties of the Parties hereto respectively.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Village and the City have caused this agreement to be signed individually by the Developer and by the appropriate officers of the City, with its seal to be hereunto affixed the day and year inserted above.
