BACKGROUND:

The Village Board denied the Tap Yard proposal to operate at Lakefront Park for their proposed 2025 schedule which included Thursday-Sunday operation. Pewaukee Lake Water Ski Club is still interested in having a beer vendor during their 2025 show season. Brewfinity had success in 2024 in fulfilling the August schedule for PLWSC shows. We do not currently have the PLWSC show schedule for 2025, but expect it to be consistent with Thursdays between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

For the 2024 season, both Brewfinity and Beergo were charged a \$50 fee for the park use on Thursday PLWSC nights.

SUBJECT:

Discussion and possible action regarding funding and replacement of Kiwanis Village Park playground equipment.

BACKGROUND:

One of the considerations in the 2025 budget process was to review use of Village Park Improvement Fund dollars to make improvements at Village parks. One of the items noted in that list was to replace the oldest pieces of playground equipment at Kiwanis Village Park. We are now to a point on determining the best use of those funds and our department is recommending this replacement to occur in spring 2025, with removal of existing equipment after this approval process.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Director Phalin is awaiting the fund balance amount for the Village Park Improvement Fund, but believes it to be about \$41,000 with the goal of replacing the playground equipment at Kiwanis Village Park for about \$31,000, keeping a \$10,000 emergency fund in this account.

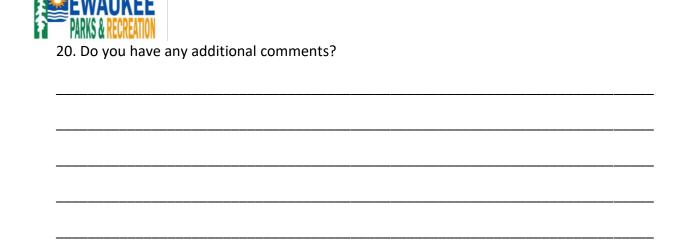
