In attendance: Mayor Bierce, Aldermen B. Bergman, C. Brown, B. Dziwulski, R. Grosch, J. Kara and J. Wamser.

Also Present: Attorney S. Riffle, Administrator S. Klein, DPW Director J. Weigel, Utility Manager J. Mueller, Fire Chief K. Bierce, Lieutenant B. Ripplinger, HR Director L. Bergersen, Community Development Director K. Woldanski, IT Director B. Kewan, Accountant C. Sazama and Clerk/Treasurer K. Tarczewski.

- 1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance – Mayor Bierce called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. **Public Comment**

Mark Buschman (N278 N2897 Lincoln Avenue) spoke in favor of having money in the 2018 budget for deer management.

Tom Perz (W278 N2955 Rocky Point Road) also spoke in favor of having money in the 2018 budget for deer management.

- 3. Consent Agenda
 - 3.1 Approval of the October 23, 2017 Common Council Meeting Minutes
 - 3.2 Approval of Bartender Licenses
 - 3.3 Approval of the Accounts Payable Listings
 - 3.4 Award of the Sale of the Surplus 2007 Sterling Plow Truck to the Town of Delafield in the amount of \$40,000 as the Highest Qualifying Bid

A motion was made and seconded, (R. Grosch, C. Brown) to approve the consent agenda. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

4. Public Hearing Regarding the 2018 Proposed Budget

> Mr. Klein stated the budget in its current form reflects the changes made during the budget workshop including the increases requested by the Library and the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District. He said the health insurance rate was reduced down to 10% but stated the HR Director is still working on reducing the number. He stated a tractor was taken out of the Park's Department budget because the Village asked Ms. Woldanski to reduce her spending.

> Mayor Bierce opened the public hearing and immediately closed it when no one in the audience expressed an interest in speaking.

5. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Approval of the 2018 Proposed Budget and Setting the Tax Levy

A motion was made and seconded, (C. Brown, B. Dziwulski) to approve the 2018 budget, and set the tax levy at \$9,085,486 and increases the tax rate 3.2% which is the equal to \$3.189 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Recommendations of the Bike and Pedestrian 6. Planning Committee to Conduct a Survey

Mr. Grosch stated the Bike & Pedestrian Planning Committee would like to conduct an online survey and put a notice in the tax insert. There was discussion amongst the Council members on how to make it a better survey.

A motion was made and seconded, (J. Wamser, B. Dziwulski) to allow the Bike & Pedestrian Planning Committee to move forward with their online survey.

Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

7. Waukesha Sheriff's Department 3rd Quarter Status Report

> Lieutenant Ripplinger was present for this item. He briefly went over the activities of the last few months. He said calls for service were up, and OWIs doubled. He noted that the archery program has been moved to South Park and that they are now working with the DNR.

8. Further Discussion on Establishing a Sidewalk Winter Maintenance Policy

Mr. Weigel was present for this item. He said he conducted a survey of area municipalities and reviewed their snow removal policies. He suggested that the City of Pewaukee recognize that there is a need to adopt an ordinance to clear sidewalks within a 21 day period and designate the City as responsible party to do such.

The Council stated they liked the Village of Germantown's policy and directed Mr. Weigel to draft an ordinance for consideration.

9. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding *Resolution No. 17-11-10* to Accept Woodleaf Reserve Addition #1 (Phase 2) Public Improvements

Mr. Weigel stated the final lift of asphalt was installed last month and the City can now formally accept improvement.

A motion was made and seconded, (J. Kara, J. Wamser) to approve Resolution 17-11-10. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

10. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Termination of the Woodleaf Reserve Addition #1 (Phase 2) Letter of Credit (#DC112672US23315) in the Amount of \$137,000 Conditioned on the Substitution of a Cash Deposit of \$10,000 and Attendant Cash Deposit Agreement to Act as the Financial Surety for the 1-Year Warranty Period

Mr. Weigel stated it is customary to have a one year warranty period on newly paved roads and was requesting the developer put up a cash deposit or a new letter of credit in the amount of \$10,000.

A motion was made and seconded, (B. Bergman, C. Brown) to reduce the cash deposit down to \$10,000 and allow staff to sign the new agreement contingent upon the attorney's approval. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

11. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Cancellation Notification of the Prairie Grass Living Letter of Credit (# 1115-548) in the Amount of \$31,438.00

Mr. Weigel stated the City received notification that this letter of credit is terminating at the end of this month, but a letter of credit or cash deposit is still needed to cover the warranty period of the final course of asphalt. He requested Council to authorize the City attorney to draw on the letter of credit prior to its termination if a new agreement and cash deposit or letter of credit cannot be established timely.

A motion was made and seconded, (J. Kara, B. Dziwulski) to authorize the attorney to move forward and obtain a new agreement and financial security for the improvements.

Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

- 13. Adjournment

A motion was made and seconded, (B. Dziwulski, J. Wamser) to adjourn the meeting at 7:42 p.m. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

BACKGROUND:

The server room backup air conditioning unit has failed. This unit, which is 10 years old, is used if the primary air conditioning unit is down for repair. The existing backup unit was too small for the server room and when it worked it could only keep the server room cool for a few hours. The replacement unit that is being considered is large enough to keep the server room cool for extended periods of time (several days) if needed.

Keeping the server room cool is critical to our network equipment; if the room is too hot for an extended period of time the equipment will fail. Currently there is an estimated \$250,000 worth of equipment in this room.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Cost to replace the backup air conditioning unit will not to exceed \$11,000.

Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Request to Authorize Delay of the Kleinhans Property at N31 W22080 Shady Lane (PWC 0912-048-001) Required Connection to Sanitary Sewer Until Connection Becomes Available in Shady Lane [Weigel]

BACKGROUND:

In 1997 the Town of Pewaukee approved a Certified Survey Map (CSM) that combined two Hill 'n Dale lots into one lot, having a house that fronts on Shady Lane and the rear lot that previously fronted on Hill 'n Dale Circle South-see air photo. Sanitary sewer is in Hill 'n Dale Circle but not Shady Lane. At that time ('97) the Town and State had a regulation that required properties to connect to sanitary sewer within one year of availability. Prior to the CSM combination, the house on the Shady Lane lot did not have access to sewer, but the vacant lot on Hill n Dale Circle did have access to sewer. The combination of the two lots into one lot created one lot with sewer availability via the rear yard (Hill n Dale Circle). We find no records of discussions at either the Plan Commission or the Town Board regarding the connection to sewer as a condition of this CSM, or dispensation of same.

In year 2000 the City of Pewaukee became aware of a change in the State regulations that no longer required connection to the sewer within one year, leaving the sewer connection issues to the local community. The City opted to extend that connection deadline to within 15 years of sewer availability.

City staff lost track of this issue (sewer connection) until we were contacted by the owner Mr. Kleinhaus inquiring whether he had to connect to sewer, or inform new owners that they had to connect to the sewer up the sale of his home. Mr. Kleinhaus also inquired whether he could revert the one lot to the original two lots, which he can no longer do (City ordinance prohibits the creation of a residential lot less than 2 ac in size without sanitary sewer). Mr. Kleinhaus' attorney, Mr. Guyette continued the conversations with the City, and the attached e-mail summarizes well the issue.

At this time the applicant is requesting the Common Council to continue the deferral from requiring this property to connect to the sewer until the sewer becomes available from Shady Lane.

It should be noted that the City of Pewaukee lost track of this parcel as it relates to sewer connection and that the Pewaukee Common Council had not extended the sewer connection beyond the current 15 year deadline expired in 2011.

I don't think I can agree to your proposal (question) without approval from the Pewaukee Common Council. We discovered in this case the fact that the property has access to sanitary sewer via Hill n Dale Circle and has not connected to the sewer within the two timeframes for connection that were in place since the lots were combined via CSM (1-year that was in effect up to 2000; 15 years for properties after 2000). The Common Council, I believe, would have to determine that special conditions exist that would allow for the continued deferment. I think an argument could be made that if/when sewer comes to Shady Lane the house would connect and the owner could/would then ask to subdivide the parcel to essentially remap the two parcels, both then with sewer, and both would meet setback requirements for the presumed zoning..... But, that is not in my purview to make that decision. Just my quick thoughts.

I received your letter of April 20 regarding the Kleinhans property. The Shady Lane sewer and water project has been pushed back another year, now planned for 2018; however, the Common Council has pushed this project back each year of the past four as we have not heard much support for the construction. As such, I am at this time not confident that the sewer would be installed next year (2018). Of course, the decision is not mine to make.

I am available to meet the next two weeks, but perhaps City Planner Harlan Clinkenbeard (Clink) should also attend. I asked Clink's advice on dividing this lot earlier this week after receiving your letter, and I have pasted a copy of that email discussion for your information:

Jeff – Congratulations! You are correct. Once the parcel was made conforming to City ordinance, vis a vis the required provision of public sanitary sewerage facilities on parcels of land under two acres, it cannot be returned to non-conforming status. Furthermore, it appears when looking at the parcel, that dividing the parcel would also render the house non-conforming in regard to rear yard setback, which is 35 feet. The City cannot be a party to the violation of its own laws.

ORDINANCE NO. 17-10

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE 7.02(13)(b) PERTAINING TO ANIMAL NUISANCES AND PROHIBITING THE FEEDING OF WILD ANIMALS AND WATERFOWL

WHEREAS, it has been well established that the feeding of wild animals and waterfowl is both detrimental to the animals and causes a public health nuisance and safety hazard that is detrimental to the health and general welfare of the public. Feeding wild animals and/or waterfowl upsets the ecosystem and can lead to property damage; and

WHEREAS, as such, the Common Council has determined that in order to protect the safety of its residents, a prohibition on feeding such animals must be instituted.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Common Council of the City of Pewaukee, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. 7.02(d)(13) shall be repealed and recreated to read as follows:

ANIMALS. Keeping, feeding, harboring, securing or failing to secure any domestic or wild animal in any manner which promotes or causes a nuisance as defined in Section 7.02(A).

§7.02(d)(13) ANIMALS

SECTION 2. 7.02(d)(13)(a) shall be created to read as follows:

§7.02(d)(13)(a) Keeping, harboring, securing or failing to secure any domestic or wild animal in any manner which promotes or causes a nuisance as defined in Section 7.02(A).

SECTION 3. 7.02(d)(13)(b) shall be created to read as follows:

§7.02(d)(13)(b) Feeding of wild animals and waterfowl prohibited. No person shall give, place, expose, deposit, distribute or scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting, or enticing wildlife or wild animals, including any animal which is not normally domesticated in this state, including but not limited to bears, coyotes, deer, foxes, rodents, groundhogs, opossums, raccoons, skunks, and the like, or waterfowl, including but not limited to ducks, geese, swans, heron, and egrets. This prohibition shall not include baiting in the legal taking of fish and/or game.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. The sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Any other ordinance whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication as required by law.

Discussion and Possible Action to Authorize City Staff to Contact Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District to renegotiate the 2000 Sewer Service Agreement [Weigel]

BACKGROUND:

In 1999 when the Town of Pewaukee incorporated into the City, the two sanitary districts technically ceased to exist: The Town of Pewaukee Sanitary District No. 3 became the City of Pewaukee Sewer Utility; and the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District (LPSD) reached an agreement to allow LPSD to continue to own and operate their sewer system within the City under certain cooperative agreements. One agreement is the 2000 Sewer Service Agreement. That agreement expires at the end of 2017, and prior to expiration and automatic extension, we believe it prudent to discuss two areas with LPSD: Section D LPSD User Charge where LPSD bills the City and City staff prepare and administer the individual sewer bills on behalf of LPSD; and Sect F Debt Service where City agreed to pay LPSD through 2017 for certain debt commitments LPSD made prior to this agreement. We believe it prudent to open up discussion on the City billing LPSD charges as we estimate that City will incur a loss of about \$3,000 next year without any further action. We believe it prudent that Section F Debt Service be renegotiated as the City agreed to continue funding LPSD that Debt Service amount in 2018, past the obligated date for other reasons, and we think it prudent that neither party construes this agreement/contract to be continued at that funding level in perpetuity.

Note that Jane's Sept. 26th memo to the Public Work's Committee contains information on LPSD billings and City of Waukesha billings, but the Waukesha issue is not on this agenda for discussion awaiting input from Public Works Committee.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There are two specific fiscal impacts to the requested actions:

- 1) Should the City not change the billing agreement with LPSD, and barring any City rate increases to accommodate the costs of service LPSD billings, then the City projects an approximate \$3,000 additional annual cost moving forward under the current agreements.
- 2) The Pewaukee Common Council agreed to continue funding LPSD at the approximate debt service level in the 2018 budget despite the fact that City had no obligation to continue this funding. We believe it appropriate to amend or change the agreement so that neither party believes that this continued funding is required under this 2000 agreement. That is, remove the debt service commitments since the timeframe for payment has expired.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Common Council authorizes City staff to contact LPSD and request a renegotiation of this expiring agreement (expires, but continues if neither side request a renegotiation).

SEWER SERVICE AGREEMENT CITY OF PEWAUKEE/LAKE PEWAUKEE SANITARY DISTRICT

INTRODUCTION

This agreement is entered by and between the LAKE PEWAUKEE SANITARY DISTRICT (LPSD) and the City of Pewaukee (City), for the administration of future sewerage services to be provided by the LPSD for an area located in the City (PS #11 service area depicted on the service area map attached as Exhibit A). The areas located within the former Town of Pewaukee serviced through LPSD were previously divided into two sections, those serviced by Pumping Station #14 and those serviced by Pumping Station #11. These service areas were detached from LPSD upon the incorporation of the City as provided for by §60.79(2)(a), Under §60.79(2)(d), Stats, the sewerage system in both areas is owned by LPSD. LPSD and the City have entered into an agreement to transfer title to all LPSD facilities within the section served by PS #14 to the City, (see Agreement dated October 19, 1999, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference). This agreement is entered into to provide for the continued operation and maintenance of the LPSD sewer system within the City by the LPSD for the PS #11 service area. This agreement also provides for future connections to the sewer systems serving the PS #11 service area, as well as billing for future operation and maintenance services by LPSD for the PS #11 service area beginning with services provided in the first quarter of 2000.

CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Private Property Owner Connection

This provision shall apply to all new individual service lateral connections to existing facilities presently owned by the LPSD within PS #11 service area. Prior to permitting any

new individual service lateral connections, the City shall pay to LPSD a Contribution in Aid of Construction (CAC) charge. The CAC charge effective January 1, 2000 is a \$4,080.00. The CAC charge shall increase annually at the rate of five (5%) percent, or as modified by LPSD, and in any event, shall be the same as charged to Town of Delafield users within the LPSD. CAC charges are based on Residential User Equivalents (RUE's) as determined by LPSD. The City shall pay the CAC charge prior to such property hooking up to the sewer system at the rate then in effect. The City shall in a timely manner advise LPSD of new connections to the originally constructed LPSD sewer systems serving the PS #11 service area.

B. Developers/Subdivision Connections

This provision shall apply to all connections to existing facilities presently owned by LPSD other than those provided for in Paragraph A above, including, but not limited to, subdivision and other multiple lot developments. The City shall not permit construction or connection to any sewer facilities owned by LPSD unless the owner or developer of the lands proposed to be served has executed a developer's agreement in a form reasonably satisfactory to LPSD. At a minimum, the Developer's Agreement shall provide that, upon satisfactory completion, all newly constructed extensions of the public system shall be dedicated to the City, and ownership thereof immediately transferred to the LPSD.

C. Existing CAC Installment Collections

The City of Pewaukee shall assist the LPSD in the collection of LPSD's CAC charges from real estate owners for charges outstanding as of December 31, 1999. The LPSD shall provide the City with the list of all installment charges by November 1 of each year. The City shall collect such outstanding charges through available means as provided by law. The City

shall remit installments/payments collected from real estate owners to LPSD within thirty (30) days of receipt.

D. LPSD User Charge

The LPSD user charge covers costs for the sewer system operated and maintained by LPSD, costs for conveying wastewater through facilities operated and maintained by the Village of Pewaukee, and costs for treatment at the Fox River Water Pollution Control Center. The charge also covers capital expenditures, and replacement costs for any portion of the debt service related to the sewer system. LPSD shall set the rate during their fall budget process. The LPSD shall determine the RUE's within the PS #11 service area and shall invoice the City for providing the above-referenced services and costs. The parties recognize that in fulfilling the terms of this agreement, the City shall be providing administrative assistance on behalf of LPSD. Accordingly, the City shall receive a \$1.00 per unit credit on the quarterly sewer user charge established by LPSD. In the event of a dispute over the reasonableness of the user charge set by LPSD, the City of Pewaukee may appeal the issue for determination by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC). In the event the PSC declines such review, the issue shall be resolved pursuant to arbitration procedures set forth in Chapter 788 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

The LPSD shall provide the City a list of all sewer users and RUE's within the PS #11 service area, connected as of December 31, 1999, no later than February 22, 2000. Thereafter, LPSD shall provide the City with an updated list of sewer users and RUE's on April 1, July 1, October 1, and January 1 for the preceding quarter. The City shall assist the LPSD in determining new sewer users located within PS #11 service area. The LPSD shall invoice

the City based on the list of sewer users and RUE's. The City shall pay the invoices within 30 days of receipt. Late charges will be added to the City's bill at a rate of 1% per month on any unpaid balance after the due date.

- D.1 <u>Billings:</u> The City shall be solely responsible for billing and collection of the charges for individual sewer users within the City, effective for the quarter ending March 31, 2000 and thereafter. LPSD shall notify the City of all changes in sewer users within fifteen days of being notified of such change.
- D.2 <u>Computation:</u> The quarterly charge shall be calculated by multiplying the number of PS #11 service area RUE's by the LPSD user charge. Charges for new connections begin on the first day of the quarter immediately following the date of connection. Users that disconnect from the system shall be charged for the full quarter for the quarter in which they disconnect. LPSD shall notify the City of any proposed changes in the billing rate at least fifteen days prior to the date of the public hearing on the LPSD budget.

E. Miscellaneous LPSD Charges/Fees for 1999 and Thereafter

For special charges other than those otherwise provided for herein, respecting all properties located in the City served by LPSD, the LPSD shall provide the City with the list of unpaid balances as of November 1, 1999, November 1, 2000, and prior to November 1 of each subsequent year. The City shall collect the unpaid balances through its tax collection process, special charge process, or other means as provided by law. The City shall remit monies received through the collection process to the LPSD within thirty days of receipt.

F. Debt Service Payment

The City of Pewaukee shall assist the LPSD in the collection of the LPSD's debt service payment relating to City's proportionate share of existing debt of the LPSD sewer system as of January 1 2001. PS #11's service area RUE's shall be the actual number adjusted annually and based upon the most recent past quarter, and PS #14 shall be limited to 111 RUE's for purposes of calculation of the City's share of existing debt service payment. Any cost or debt associated with additional RUE's within PS #14 shall be the sole responsibility of the City. The City's proportionate share of the existing debt service payment shall be determined by multiplying the debt service payment for the upcoming year times a fraction where the numerator is the total of City RUE's as described above and the denominator is the total of all RUE's served by the LPSD system. The City shall collect the unpaid balances through its tax collection process, special charges or other means as provided by law and as determined by City. The LPSD shall provide the City with the listing of all debt service payments for collection by November 1 of each year. The City shall remit such payments collected to LPSD within thirty days of receipt.

G. Term

This agreement shall be effective upon execution, and that portion of this agreement related to debt service (Paragraph F) shall terminate at midnight December 31, 2017. Thereafter, the remaining terms of this agreement shall be extended for a period of ten years, unless either party notifies the other of its intent not to extend, or to seek modification of the terms of this agreement 90 days prior to the termination date. In the event of a modification notice, the terms stated herein shall remain in force until further agreement or

termination.

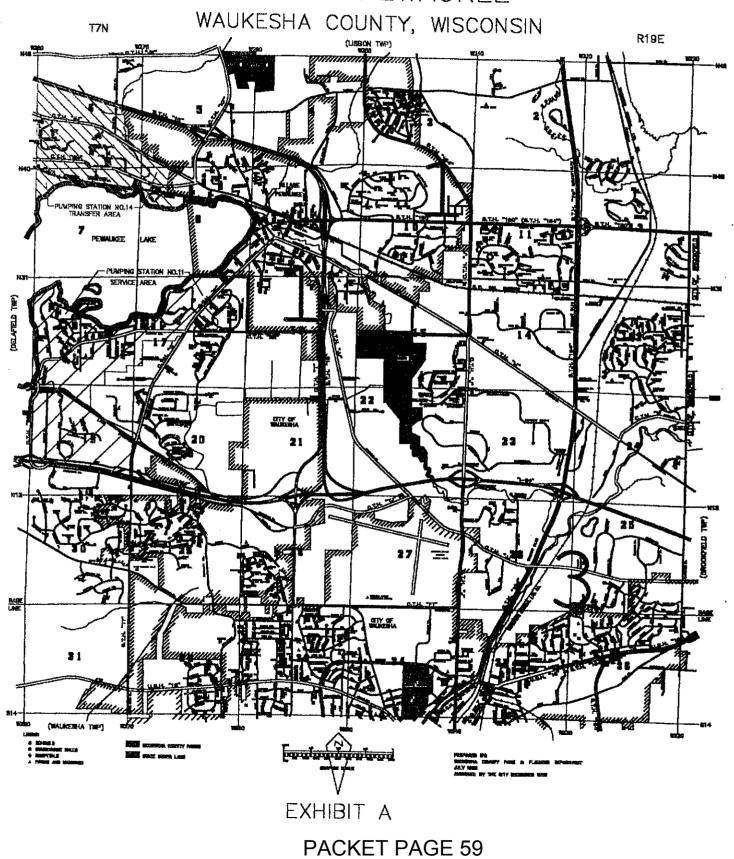

Dear Chairman Nowacki,

In 2000, the City of Pewaukee was granted "City" status by the Wisconsin Department of Administration. Subsequently, the newly formed City of Pewaukee and Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District entered into a sewer service agreement. LPSD would continue to operate and maintain the sanitary sewer system within the PS#11 service area, while the City would take over the quarterly billing/collections for LPSD in this service area. Other provisions in the agreement include assisting the District in collecting Contribution in Aid of Construction (CAC) fees as well as assisting LPSD with negotiating Developer's Agreements in new developments.

Section F. "Debt Service Payment" will expire at the end of this year. The City of Pewaukee would like to exercise the option to renegotiate some of the terms of the original agreement at this time. Over the last several years we have had situations that need to clarification in the existing agreement and need to include details on some other issues that have arisen in the last several years. Also of importance is the need to revisit the \$1.00 per unit credit of the quarterly user charge that is issued to the City Utility for maintaining the sewer accounts.

We respectfully request that City staff be allowed to work directly with District staff to put together a draft revised agreement.

Re: Consideration of implementation of multiple sewer service rates for the City of

Pewaukee.

The City of Pewaukee provides sanitary sewer service to approximately 4,640 utility customers throughout much of the City. In 1999 as the Town of Pewaukee gained City status, the Utility/City entered into an agreement with Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District to provide for continued operation and maintenance of the LPSD sewer system within the City of Pewaukee. The agreement includes provisions that the City of Pewaukee Water & Sewer Utility will bill/collect fees from those customers located within the LPSD sewer service area. This agreement is up for renewal by December 31, 2017.

LPSD sends a quarterly bill to the City Utility office on a quarterly basis. The current rate for Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District is \$108.00 per residential equivalent unit. The current number of residential equivalent units within LPSD is 1068.5, with a total of 1064 active units for 976 customer bills. (Businesses and multifamily buildings can have multiple REU's assigned depending on the building use.) The Utility receives \$1.00 credit per REU for administrative, postage and stationary. In prior contract years the City Utility was making a small profit from the difference between the two differing rates as the City charged one common rate for all sewer customers. That profit gap has lessened as LPSD's rates have increased annually and the City rates have remained stagnant since 2013, at which time the rate was increased by 3.18% (to fund upgrades for the Brookfield treatment plant.) Casual discussions with LPSD staff indicate that they anticipate a 2% rate increase to \$110.16 per REU per quarter for 2018. We anticipate a loss next year of approximately \$3,000.00.

The Utility staff would like to see the "Agreement" re-opened so that the City could negotiate an increase in the credit that is issued to the City. The billing clerks have determined that this credit is insufficient to recoup the amount of time spent in the administration of these utility accounts. In addition to the time spent during quarterly billing, approximately 8 hours additional time is spent on LPSD accounts in between billing cycles.

City of Waukesha Sewer Rates

The City of Pewaukee maintains and operates a sanitary sewer collection system in the southwest section of the City. The sanitary sewage flows to the City of Waukesha Wastewater Treatment plant/system. The City of Pewaukee receives sewer bills for each resident that is served by the City of Waukesha. We currently receive and process approximately 175 individual bills from the City of Waukesha. The current average quarterly sewer rate from the City of Waukesha is \$174.17. This leaves a loss to the Utility of approximately \$11,229.75 per quarter in 2017. (2017 loss to the City of Pewaukee Utility-\$44,919.00) This gap will widen in 2018 if the anticipated rate increase of 9.25% passes the City of Waukesha Common Council. We are also aware of significant infrastructure improvements that will need to be constructed in the next several years to meet the requirements to implement Waukesha's quest to receive Lake Michigan water. The anticipated quarterly rate will rise to \$190.20 in 2018 creating a loss of \$56,196.51.

In the past, the City of Pewaukee Water & Sewer Utility could absorb the cost differential a little easier. However, as the cost of doing business is getting more expensive along with large infrastructure maintenance projects we cannot sustain the stagnant rates any longer.

Action/Recommendation:

- 1) The City of Pewaukee Water & Sewer Utility recommend completing an overall review of the current sewer rates
- 2) Consider implementing a multi-tier sewer rate structure:
 - A. City of Pewaukee (Main service area?)
 - B. LPSD service area
 - C. City of Waukesha service area.

We recommend implementing a 2 tier system recognizing the significant cost differential to those customers in the Waukesha sewer service area. We recommend phasing in the cost difference with an increase of \$30 - \$40.00 over the City's "Main" rate with the intention that the rate will continue to rise over three years until the rate the City of Pewaukee charges matches the rate that the City of Waukesha will charge out.

At this time we also recommend charging one common rate for the City of Pewaukee main service area and Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District as the current rate is very similar, recognizing that the Sewer Service Agreement should be reevaluated and possibly renegotiated on an annual basis.
