Mr. Bergman asked that Item #3.2 be removed for discussion and Ms. Brown requested Item #3.3 also be removed.

A motion was made and seconded, (J. Wamser, C. Brown) to approve the remaining items on the consent agenda. Motion Passed: 5-For, 0-Against.

3.2 Approve of Common Council Meeting Minutes Dated April 2, 2018.

A motion was made and seconded, (C. Brown, B. Dziwulski) to approve the minutes dated April 2, 2018. Motion Passed: 4-For, 0-Against, 1-Abstain (B. Bergman).

3.3 Approve Accounts Payable Listing

Ms. Brown questioned the \$3,500 bill for the Gun Club lift station cleaning. She asked if the party responsible for the issue was found. Mr. Weigel stated it was Schutzman Nuts. He said they have been reimbursing the City on a weekly basis. Mr. Weigel stated they are in the process of adding a large grease settling tank that should take care of the issue and should be online soon.

A motion was made and seconded, (C. Brown, R. Grosch) to approve the accounts payable listing. Motion Passed: 6-For, 0-Against.

4. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Municipal Treasurers Appreciation Proclamation and Naming April 15-21, 2018 as Municipal Treasurers Appreciation Week

A motion was made and seconded, (B. Bergman, C. Brown) to approve the Municipal Treasurers Appreciation Proclamation and naming April 15-21, 2018 as Municipal Treasurers Appreciation Week. Motion Passed: 5-For, 0-Against.

5. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Building Safety Proclamation and Naming May 2018 as Building Safety Month

Motion Passed: 5-For, 0-Against.

7. Update Regarding Positively Pewaukee Activities

Mayor Bierce stated he has invited all of the City's partners to come before the Council to give periodic updates on their organizations and include how the City's money is being spent.

Elaine Kroening from Positively Pewaukee approached the Council. She stated they have changed their mission statement to "Building Community, Fostering Business and Producing Events". She stated there are over 200 volunteers in the organization who truly care about the community.

She updated the Council on several projects they are currently working on. She stated they have been doing a monthly merchant meeting that has expanded over the last few months. She said she works with developers and something exciting is coming up in the near future. Ms. Kroening said hosting events is one of the largest things they do, in which Ms. Kroening thanked the Council for their financial support and said she couldn't have done them without the City's support. She spoke of the Taste of Lake Country and is drawing big talent. She also thanked the Sheriff's Department who worked with them on their races. Ms. Kroening stated they are expanding their food truck rally and are doing a classic car and Harley show in conjunction with the Waukesha/Pewaukee Visitor's Bureau.

Ms. Kroening spoke about the Community Connection program. She stated last year they distributed 200 back packs to kids in the Pewaukee School District and provide winter clothes and snacks for the kids in need.

She said she is very happy with the partnership she has with Park & Recreation Department and the Fire Department. Mr. Wamser stated she was a benefit to the taxpayers and the quality of life in the community.

8. Update Regarding the Pewaukee Library

Jennie Stoltz the Pewaukee Library Director shared a PowerPoint presentation with the Council.

She stated staff has created book recommendation pamphlets which assist patrons in selecting new items to read. She stated they joined the Bridges System which not only includes Waukesha County but Jefferson County as well, which gives them more databases and more funding too. Ms. Stoltz stated there are numerous children's programs which utilize science, math and art which are more hands on activities.

She said recently they applied for a grant to print off "library hacks" cards which explain all the various different types of Library services they provide. In all, there are 36 cards.

Ms. Stoltz stated there are online courses available for free. She stated the library also has a dementia friendly program providing memory cafes which gives support to the caregivers.

Alderman Wamser appreciates the customer service tracking they are doing and the innovated ideas. He said he wasn't aware of all of the programs they do.

9. Police Services 2017 Year End Report

Lieutenant Ripplinger presented the year end report.

He said he was very happy with the new third shift that came on board. He said calls for service are up about 600-800 runs from the previous year. He noted there was no spring weight enforcement in 2017 because of weather conditions. Lieutenant Ripplinger reported that the CVS prescription drug box was down about 25 pounds from the previous year. He reported that heroin related calls are up and continue to rise. Safety talks were down in 2017 however are on the rise for 2018 because of all the tragedies around the nation.

Lieutenant Ripplinger stated interest in the community programs continues to grow.

He presented the yearly statistics and noted there was a difference in citations; some are due to contractual services and others are based on the different types of grants such as speed, alcohol and seatbelt that the deputies were involved in.

Calls for service overall have gone up and citations have gone down.

Discussion and Possible Action to Authorize a New Street Lamp on the Existing Power Pole in the 10. Northeast Quadrant of the Elmwood Drive & North Avenue Intersection

Mr. Weigel stated the cost is \$384.88 to add a light to the existing pole. He added the monthly electrical costs would be \$15.69.

Alderman Bergman asked if there were any street light options.

Mayor Bierce voiced his concerns about the residents living near a pole and how the lights could potentially shine in their home.

Mr. Weigel stated the best practice is to illuminate intersections on major roadways.

A motion was made and seconded, (B. Bergman, J. Wamser) to authorize a new street lamp on existing power pole at the intersection of Elmwood Drive and North Avenue in amount not to exceed \$384.88, approving the monthly \$15.69 utility costs and directing staff to inquire if we can get a LED fixture. Motion Passed: 5-For, 0-Against.

10. Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the Project List for Updating the Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan and the Impact Fee Study

Mr. Weigel stated a project list was previously approved and after that time the Bike and Pedestrian Planning Committee was created and they have indicated they would like to see additional projects added to the list. He asked the Council to approve inclusion of official bike/hike trails that would 1) connect the Lake Country Trail to East Fieldhack Drive, 2) a trail on Meadowbrook Road from the existing trail at approximately East Fieldhack Drive northerly to the City/Village border, 3) a trail or sidewalk along Northview Road from where it ends at Hwy TT westerly to South Park, 4) pedestrian crossing at Pewaukee Road and Ridgeview Parkway, 5) Watertown Road / CTH M from 164 west to Forest Grove, 6) two recreational crossings on Hwy SS for a safer pathway to the school and 7) connection from our subdivisions to our City parks.

Alderman Grosch questioned if some paths could be wood chips to save on money. Mr. Weigel stated they could, but he advises against it. It would be dangerous if they washed out and there are ADA considerations that would have to be looked into.

Alderman Brown asked if these projects would have to come before the Council for funding approval. Mr. Weigel stated they would have to authorize them at the time. He said if it is the true intent of the Common Council not to spend the money he would prefer that these projects not get approved and be directed to give the money back. Ms. Brown stated she has concerns about what the costs could potentially be.

Alderman Grosch was very much in favor and feels we are way behind our neighbors. The survey done by the committee supports this list of projects as well.

Alderman Bergman suggested before moving forward, perhaps we need to get more specific with this bike/hike plan especially since we have been collecting funds for it. He suggested prioritizing projects and determining if they fit within our budget. He said we need to determine if we will support this or not. He said he wants to be certain this is worth the Engineering Department's time. He said he was in favor of it and of course was more willing to support the smaller projects but doesn't want to burden staff to redo a plan if there is no support for it.

Alderman Grosch reinforced that the plan has to be redone in order to determine if we can use the funds for the projects. He asked if it would be done in-house or require a consultant. Mr. Weigel stated a consultant would be faster.

Mayor Bierce asked if anyone was in favor of giving up on the bike/pedestrian plan and returning money. Everyone responded 'no'.

### A motion was made and seconded, (R. Grosch, J. Wamser) to approve the project list for updating the Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan and the Impact Fee Study.

Motion Passed: 5-For, 0-Against.

#### 12. Discussion Related to the First Quarter Financial Report

Administrator Klein stated what he heard was that the Council wants the ability to discuss the financial position of the City on a quarterly basis. He stated he reviews the accountant's statements monthly as well as the Department Heads. He said at this time everything seems to be in line. He said if anything was out of budget or was anticipated to be, it would be brought before the Council for consideration.

Mayor Bierce asked if there were any questions, there were none.

Alderman Brown appreciates having the quarterly opportunity as a heads up.

Alderman Dziwulski questioned whether or not Scott has anything to compare those reports against and to see where we should be at each quarter. Mr. Klein stated he bases it on where the percentages fall. He said he also reviews the capital expenditures and sees what is in the works.

Ms. Brown questioned if they should be concerned about the water utility being \$1,000,000 in the hole. Mr. Weigel stated the utility only receives revenue quarterly, so the numbers are down. For the water more revenue is received in the  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  quarters.

Attorney Riffle suggested quarterly reports to include historical information so you can compare previous years to determine if things are on track or stand out. Ms. Brown asked if this would be asking too much from Carol.

Ms. Woldanski suggested asking Carol if that would be difficult to do. Mayor Bierce felt at a minimum they should start a historical perspective and ask Carol if it's possible to include a previous year column. Mayor advised everyone to ask questions whenever.

#### RESOLUTION 18-05-11 NOTICE REGARDING INSPECTION OF PUBLIC RECORDS

Except as otherwise provided, any person has a right to inspect public records and to make or receive a copy of any public records as provided in Chapter 19, Subchapter II, Wisconsin Statutes, and applicable municipal ordinances.

Requests to inspect public records must be made to the City Clerk/Treasurer at the Pewaukee City Hall, W240 N3065 Pewaukee Road, Pewaukee, Wisconsin, 53072.

Public records may be requested, inspected and copies obtained during normal business hours Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. In some cases, records may require retrieval from archives and therefore may not be immediately available for inspection.

The cost of photocopying shall be 25¢ per page, plus sales tax, which has been calculated to be the actual, necessary and direct cost of reproduction. In some cases additional charges may apply, such as to recover costs for locating a record, mailing or shipping costs, or photographing and photographic processing costs, and in some cases prepayment may also be required, as allowed by law.

In addition to the 15 neighborhoods identified and depicted on the map presented as Exhibit A and on the individual neighborhood plans presented above, there are four small and two larger areas within the City boundaries that do not 'fit' within any of the 15 delineated neighborhoods, primarily due to the irregularities of the City's mutual boundary with adjoining municipalities. The six non-neighborhood 'areas' together total 557.6 acres or 0.87 square miles, of which 81% is water, wetlands and floodplain area. Each of the six 'areas' has been colored orange and given a letter designation beginning with the letter A, as shown on Exhibit A. Following is a description of the existing land uses and the proposed plan for each of the six non-neighborhood land/water 'areas' as a part of the general City Comprehensive Plan for 2050:

Area A -- This 'area' lies in the NW quadrant of the City an encompasses a small area of the SW one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 5 and a large area of Section 8 including 132.5 acres of Lake Pewaukee, together totaling 202.1 acres. Area A is bounded on the north by Capitol Drive (CTH JJ); on the east by the City's mutual boundary with the Village of Pewaukee; on the south by a part of the lake located within the South Lake Neighborhood; and, on the west by the section line between Sections 6 & 7 and 5 & 8. Like the Hillside-Glacier Neighborhood to the west, the 'area' is divided in an east/west direction by both Glacier Road and the Canadian Pacific (CP) Railroad tracks.

With the exception of one small business and a few single-family homes abutting Glacier Road, existing land use in that portion of the 'area' north of Glacier Road is almost entirely floodplain and wetlands adjacent to Coco Creek, which drains south into Lake Pewaukee. Existing land use in the area between Glacier Road and the CP Railroad and on Kopmeier Drive between the CP Railroad and Lake Pewaukee consist of single-family homes, some dating back to the 1920s. The only land access to the Kopmeier Drive area of the City is through the Village of Pewaukee.

The long-range plans for Area A propose no significant changes to the area unless there is future redevelopment of the area during the plan period (2015 -2050). Existing streets in the area will remain with no proposed additional streets.

Area B -- This very small 'area' consists of four parcels of land totaling 8.2 acres located in the NE corner of the SE one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 10. Area B is bounded on the north by Capitol Drive (STH 190); on the east by Pewaukee Road (STH 164); and, on the south and west by the City's mutual boundary with the Village of Pewaukee. Existing land use in the area consists of three commercial properties and an older six acre farm house and property which backs on medium density residential properties in the Village. The only viable access to the commercial properties is a 'right-in, right-out' driveway from Pewaukee Road. The City's 2050 plans for the 'area' proposes

that the commercial uses remain with only the current limited driveway access with no new public or private <u>street</u> access to either Pewaukee Road or Capitol Drive and the old farm property be developed for medium density residential uses during the 2015-2050 plan period. <u>It should be noted, however, that the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's current (2016) long-range plans for the adjacent intersection of Capitol Drive (STH 190) and Pewaukee Road (STH 164) is to build a two level multi-lane interchange to replace the current standard at-grade signalized multi-lane intersection. It is anticipated that such a structure will require the acquisition of adjacent properties, which may have significant impact on the properties within Area B.</u>

Area C -- This 'area' consists of four properties totaling 38.3 acres located in the SE corner of the SE one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 10. Area C lies immediately north of the Pewaukee City Hall campus and is bounded on the north by the City's mutual boundary with the Village of Pewaukee; on the east by Pewaukee Road (STH 164); on the south by the section line between Sections 10 and 15 (also the north boundary of the City Hall campus); and, on the west by the City's mutual boundary with the Village. This 'area' is separated from Area B by two small parcels located in the Village.

Existing land use in the 'area' includes an approximately 27 acre Lutheran church property and three older residential properties. The City's 2050 plans for the area propose that the church remain and any developable land among the four properties be developed as medium density residential uses during the 2015 – 2050 plan period.

Area D -- This 'area' consists of several parcels of land straddling the Pewaukee River and located in both the SE one-quarter of the SE one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 22 and the NE one-quarter of the NE one-quarter of Section 27 and totaling 50.1 acres. Area D is bounded on the north by I-94; on the east by Pewaukee Road (CTH J); and, on the south and west by the City's mutual boundary with the City of Waukesha.

Existing land use in the 'area' includes an office use parcel and a large area of floodplain/wetlands on the north side of the Pewaukee River and several medium density single-family residences and some floodplain lands on the south side of the river. The City's long-range plan for this area is that all existing uses remain and any developable land south of the river and its floodplain be developed as medium density residential use during the plan period, however, the provision of public sanitary sewers is questionable.

Area E – This very small 'area' consists of an approximately two (2) acres, including a single-family parcel located in the NW one-quarter of the NE one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 16. Area E is bounded on the north by the City's mutual boundary with the Village of Pewaukee; on the east by Main Street and STH 16; and, on the south and west by the City's mutual

boundary with the Village of Pewaukee. This small single property is tied to the rest of the City to the south by a narrow territorial corridor along the rights-of-way of Main Street and the extension of CTH T (Grandview Boulevard). (*Please see Exhibit A*). It is proposed to eventually transfer this parcel along with the narrow street right-of-way corridor, to the Village. The only basic services provided to this property by the City is emergency service.


Area F -- This relatively large 'area' consists of three properties encompassing 256.9 acres located in the southern one-half of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 16 and the northern one-quarter of Section 21. Area F is bounded on the north by College Avenue (CTH SS) and the City's mutual boundary with the Village of Pewaukee; on the east by Grandview Boulevard (CTH T); on the south by Fatima Road and the City's mutual boundary with the City of Waukesha; and, on the west by the section line between Sections 16 & 17 and 20 & 21.

The 'area', underlain with several feet of peat soils, was, many years ago, a 'wet' vegetable farming area. The entire acreage is now classed as wetlands with a high quality bird sanctuary and other wildlife habitat. It is proposed on the City's long-range plans that land and water in this 'area' remain in their natural state forever.

The 2050 Plan for the Non-neighborhood Land/Water Areas is an update and revision of the Non-neighborhood Land/Water Areas for 2035 adopted in 2012. After public hearing and subsequent revision, this 2050 Plan for the Non-neighborhood Areas of the City was adopted by the City Plan Commission on February 15, 2018 and by the City Common Council on March 5, 2018.





#### **RESOLUTION NO. 18-05-13**

# A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING CERTAIN FUNDS FOR PREPAYMENT OF DECOMMISSIONING AND DECONTAMINATION MONIES IN ITS GOVERNMENT WATER FUND AS THE "RESERVE FOR RADIUM REMOVAL CONTINGENCIES"

WHEREAS, on or about the 18<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2006, the City of Pewaukee, Wisconsin ("municipality") entered into a certain Radium Removal System Agreement ("Agreement") between the Municipality and WRT Environmental LLC and R.M.D. Operations LLC (both companies, along with Water Remediation Technology LLC ("WRT") being associated companies within the WRT International LLC group of companies), a true and correct copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS**, on or about October 30, 2008, as part of a corporate consolidation within the group of WRT International LLC companies, Water Remediation Technology LLC assumed all the assets, rights, obligations, and responsibilities of both WRT Environmental LLC and R.M. D. Operations LLC; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Agreement, radium is removed from the municipality's public water supply, specifically at Pewaukee Well No. 2, and then must be removed from certain treatment vessels and transported to a licensed disposal facility; and

WHEREAS, under the Agreement, WRT, a current licensee of the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (Department) pursuant to Wisconsin Administrative Code, Chapter DHS 157 (WI Admin. Code) is required to remove and properly dispose of the spent media which contains radium from a radium removal site ("Site or Sites") owned or operated by the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the municipality acknowledges that, while WRT has contractual and legal obligations to remove all the collected radium from the Site or Sites, if WRT does not remove the radium from the Site or Sites, such removal obligation will, as a practical matter, devolve upon the municipality as the owner of the underlying property; and

**WHEREAS**, WI Admin. Code DHS 157.15 requires that the licensee (WRT) must provide satisfactory financial assurances to the Department to ensure the protection of public health and safety in the event of abandonment, default, inability or other failure of WRT to properly remove all the radium from the Site or Sites; and

**WHEREAS**, under the Agreement, the municipality has assumed the responsibility of satisfying relevant Department regulatory requirements under WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157 for providing financial assurances; and

**WHEREAS**, the exemption provisions of WI Admin. Code DHS 157.04 can allow for alternate financial assurances as approved by the Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the municipality intends to provide such financial assurances without prejudice to any action, cause of action, lawsuit or other recourse which it may have against WRT or others, under the Agreement or through some other action either at law or in equity; and

WHEREAS, in adopting this Resolution and the attached Government Fund Guarantee and Municipality Treasurer Statement, the municipality hereby obligates itself as a matter of law with regard to the Department, as if it were a licensee under WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157, for the purposes of performing decommissioning and decontamination (D&D) activities as herein contemplated and required by WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157 in the event that WRT fails to properly perform D&D activities as determined by the Department; and

WHEREAS, the municipality's Government Water Fund, or similar type of restricted-asset account, has and will have sufficient cash and/or investments available in accordance with approved site-specific decommissioning cost estimates to perform the radium removal and any other related decommissioning activities required under WI Admin. Code ch. HFS 157 without materially affecting the cash flow and operation of the municipality's water system; and

**WHEREAS**, the municipality has previously utilized substantially similar forms of financial assurance for related water treatment and operational activities in accordance with State of Wisconsin regulatory requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and city council of the Municipality of the City of Pewaukee, Waukesha County, Wisconsin as follows:

#### **Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles.**

The Preambles to this Resolution and all Exhibits are incorporated herein as if fully set forth in this Section 1.

#### Section 2. Creation of Reserve.

There is hereby created within the municipality's Government Water Fund, or similar type of restricted-asset account, the following specific line item: "Reserve for Radium Removal Contingencies" (the "Reserve"). The Reserve is intended to be designated for the sole and specific purpose of isolating funds for D&D activities related to licensed radium water treatment operations at the municipality's water treatment facility(ies) as designated in this Resolution and all applicable Exhibits in the event that WRT does not initiate or complete such D&D activities.

#### Section 3. Reserve Balance.

Unless monies in the Reserve are used to remove radium from a Site or Sites, the municipality shall maintain a balance in the Reserve of **not less than \$59,840**. The Reserve shall be fully funded 90 days from the date of this Resolution, the earliest anticipated date when D & D activities and removal of spent media may become necessary should the licensee be unable or fail to perform its contractual obligation. The monies in this Reserve may not be used for any purpose except removal and disposal of radium from the Site or Sites and other decommissioning activities under WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157 which are authorized by the Department. These monies shall be held for the benefit of the Department until such time as Department regulations, statutes, or other applicable rule(s) and/or opinion(s) no longer require this commitment. The amount in the Reserve shall be increased or decreased based on an updated Reclamation Plan and Cost Estimate as approved in writing by the Department.

#### Section 4. Use of Reserve.

In the event of a default by WRT under the Agreement or when otherwise required by the Department, the municipality shall remove and properly dispose of all such radium in a properly licensed disposal facility. The Department shall have oversight and prior approval of any expenditures of the Reserve. Unless and until released by the Department, the municipality may utilize the monies earmarked in the Reserve only for the D&D activities referenced herein. In the event that the municipality is unable to accomplish decommissioning in a timely manner as determined by the Department, the municipality shall transfer all funds in the Reserve to the Department as directed in writing by the Department.

#### Section 5. Guarantee.

The municipality's Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the municipality a Government Fund Guarantee substantially in the form of Exhibit B attached hereto. The municipality's Treasurer is directed to execute the Statement substantially in the form of Exhibit C attached hereto.

#### Section 6. Severability.

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution is held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution.

#### Section 7. Repealer.

All ordinances, resolutions, orders or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are to the extent of such conflict, hereby deemed inoperable.

#### **Section 8. Effective Date.**

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect after its passage and approval. The municipality may not repeal or amend this Resolution without the prior written consent of the Department.

#### **EXHIBIT B**

#### **GOVERNMENT FUND GUARANTEE**

This Government Fund Guarantee ("Government Fund Guarantee") is made this 7<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018 by the City of Pewaukee, Wisconsin ("municipality") to the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services, ("Department"). For purposes of this Government Fund Guarantee, the "licensee" means Water Remediation Technology LLC or its successors or assigns. This Government Fund Guarantee is being given in accordance with Water Remediation Technology LLC's Wisconsin Radioactive Materials License No. 133-2032-01.

#### **RECITALS**

- 1. The municipality has the full authority and capacity to enter into this Government Fund Guarantee under the authority of and cited in Resolution No. 18-05-13 adopted by the municipality.
- 2. This Government Fund Guarantee is being issued to comply with regulations issued by the Department, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute Chapter 254, *Environmental Health*, Subchapter III, *Radiation Protection*. The Department has promulgated regulations in WI Admin. Code s. DHS 157.15 that require that certain specific licensees provide assurance that funds will be available when needed for reclamation activities. While the municipality is not a licensee, as approved by the Department, pursuant to its contract with WRT, the municipality hereby agrees to provide this Government Fund Guarantee on behalf of the licensee.
- 3. The Government Fund Guarantee is issued to provide financial assurance for reclamation activities associated with the removal of radium from the municipality's public water supply as required by WI Admin. Code s. DHS 157.15. The reclamation costs are as follows: \$59,840. This amount shall be in a separate Reserve within 90 days after the date of this Government Fund Guarantee
- 4. Reclamation activities refer to all the decommissioning activities required by WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157 for a treatment facility located at:

Pewaukee Well No. 2, N31 W22610 Green Road, Pewaukee WI 53072.

5. The municipality guarantees to the Department that in the event of an inability of or a refusal by the licensee to perform according to Agreement or when otherwise required by the Department, it will: (A) Carry out the required reclamation activities as required by WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157; or (B) Upon written notification from the Department, pay the reclamation cost amount guaranteed for the Facility(ies) to the Department as directed by the Department. The Department shall have oversight and prior approval of any expenditure of the funds pledged herein.

- 6. The municipality shall submit audited financial statements to the Department annually, within 180 days after the close of its fiscal year. Upon review, if the Department deems necessary, the municipality shall provide alternate financial assurance within 120 days of such written notice by the Department.
- 7. The municipality, for itself and its successors and assigns, expressly agrees to remain bound under this Government Fund Guarantee, as if it were the licensee, in the event of the inability or failure of the licensee to perform D&D activities pursuant to WRT's license, notwithstanding any or all of the following: amendment or modification of the license or Department-approved decommissioning funding plan for that facility, the extension or reduction of the time of performance of required activities, or any other modification or alteration of an obligation of the license pursuant to WI Admin. Code ch. DHS 157.
- 8. The municipality shall remain bound under this Government Fund Guarantee for as long as the licensee retains Wisconsin Radioactive Materials License No. 133-2032-01 for the municipality's water treatment facility as delineated in the Resolution and for as long as WRT must comply with applicable financial assurance requirements of such license for the previously-listed facility.
- 9. All bound parties shall be jointly and severally liable for all litigation costs, including reasonable attorney fees, incurred by the Department in any successful effort to enforce this Guarantee. For the purpose of establishing venue in any action brought by the Department to enforce the Guarantee of Prepayment, Dane County shall be deemed the county in which the Department's claim arose.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Earlier this year we (Public Works Director Weigel and Alderman Bergman) were contacted by a resident of Victoria Station Phase IV with a safety concern relating to the intersection of Cambridge Street & Charlotte Way. The concern relating to cars neither stopping or slowing down in the intersection and a those actions posing a safety risk to the subdivision residents, and in particular the children preparing for school bus transport. Upon investigation we found that this three-way intersection has no stop signs. We also found that the northerly part of Charlotte Way has not stop signs at its intersection with Wilhar Road.

Should the neighborhood prefer a higher level of intersection control, then three way stop signs at Charlotte Way & Cambridge and Charlotte Way & Wilhar Road would also improve safety.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

From an installation aspect, the cost would be the typical \$150 per stop sign which includes the materials and installation. From a risk management standpoint there should be some control on these intersections as we have heard from one resident on same.

#### **RECOMMENDED MOTION:**

Staff recommends that a minimum that a stop sign be authorized at north-bound Cambridge Street at Charlotte Way, and at south-bound WIlhar Road at Charlotte Way.
