Explanation of changes from 2019 to 2020 - They found Saturdays to be less fruitful than Fridays and fall weathers seems to be against them. It was tough to attract food vendors and customers for multiple days due to the amount of festivals, etc, happening on weekends during the summer. Also with Labor Day being late in 2020, they chose 4 weekends for Parktoberfest, instead of 5. Ideally they would like to cut out October all together due to weather issues in the past few years, but will keep the first weekend in October to not cut the total event so short.

For the 2020 season, three boat slips have been accepted from the waiting list by the Beachscapes Condo Association. They were on the waiting list and have accepted all three spots offered to them.

Currently, they do not have any tenants, so the slips will remain empty. When they do receive tenants, they will have boats in the water and necessary insurance. I am looking for direction on who 'owns' the slip once the tenant is present.

I believe the most appropriate would be that the Beachscapes Association owns the slip, but the boat owner provides all necessary paperwork including contact information, boat type, boat owner's insurance, etc. Should the tenant choose to move, the Beachscapes Association would retain ownership of the slip for their next tenant.

The Pewaukee Kiwanis have successfully completed \$100,000 worth of equipment and work at Kiwanis Village Park of their \$100,000, 20-year term for naming rights. They have provided funds to replace a significant amount of playground equipment and we are very happy with how things have turned out.

Pat Gallagher, of the Kiwanis, recently mentioned they are looking to choose another park project to contribute to in the future, preferably in the City of Pewaukee. They have an estimated amount of funds, but have an additional amount of approximately \$11,000 remaining from their initial \$100,000 commitment towards Kiwanis Village Park due to rebates on the purchase thanks to their committed volunteer base that helped with equipment installation.

I'm looking for direction on where these \$11,000 are to be allocated for future Pewaukee Parks improvements.

# **Seasonal Recreation Programs Report Fall 2019**

This Recreational Programs report covers programs offered in our Fall 2019 Program Guide.

### **Summary:**

Fall season went well despite having fewer offerings than 2018. We ended up cutting a few of our preschool programs for 2019 when we lost our previous preschool instructor and we also cut a few of our special events that did not run in 2018. Our senior programs are still booming and continue to increase each season.

#### **Preschool:**

We offered three preschool enrichment classes, one of which was cancelled due to low enrollment. Our new preschool instructor has put together a great list for 2020 and we have already seen better enrollment moving into 2020.

## Youth:

The Flag Football program did well this year and staffing for the program was excellent! This is a big change because we struggle each year to find good staff. We hired one new adult staff person and then I was able to recruit two of my young day camp staff to fill in the other spots. We also had a good number of volunteer coaches at season's start and a new coach Power Point presentation was created to help with organization. Registration for 2019 increased by 10 participants.

Out of our 2019 art classes, we ended up cancelling two of the four. One because of an instructor issue (death in the family) and one for low enrollment. The numbers for the other two classes were strong. Our intergenerational classes "Building Bridges" both had good numbers and have been well-received. A trend we have been seeing regarding our Badges & Buddies program (Partnership with Waukesha County Sheriff's Department) has been that registration has not filled as quickly as in years past. We will continue to monitor this program and make changes as needed.

## Adults:

The majority of our yoga classes were moved permanently to St. Bartholomew's Church on Monday mornings and Tuesday evenings. We came up with an agreement with St. Bart's that we would be able to utilize the space at no charge during the school year, but would pay for the space rental during the summer. This agreement is going well and the participants and instructor really like the location. We are still hosting yoga at Nettesheim Park on Thursday evenings. Numbers were pretty good for most classes.

We offered Adult Spanish class this fall per the request of our summer participants and it ran. We are offering it again in the spring.

#### **Seniors:**

Numbers are through the roof with our Senior Fitness programs and participants are loving it. Classes are back at Wagner Park after being at multiple locations during summer months. It makes things much easier to have all the equipment in one place. Our Positively Fit class increased by 26 participants from 2018 – 2019.

## **Special Events:**

## **Super Senior Open House**

This is a free event for the community. We provide a list of organizations and businesses of interest to seniors, have a speaker and provide lunch. We had over 70 participants this year!

# **Senior Holiday Social**

This is a Christmas potluck event where seniors come together, bring a dish to pass and play a white elephant gift exchange. This year we brought in an Elvis impersonator for entertainment. We had over 60 attendees!

## SUBJECT:

Discussion and possible action regarding the Laimon Park Parking Lot layout.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Upon further discussion with raSmith in regards to the relocation of the transformer at Laimon Park - I was informed that the transformer relocation would likely take up one parking spot.

The parking lot would gain two truck/boat trailer spots, and lose one, not three, car parking spots.

The transformer would be located near the building in the proposal. The dumpster that is also in the enclosure would need to be relocated on Loie Laimon's property moving forward. This was a verbal agreement at the time of purchase that the dumpster would stay as is until any parking lot construction.

The initially quoted fee to relocate the transformer from WE Energies was \$13,231.69 + \$219 in seasonal charges for a total of \$13,450.69 to gain two trailer parking stalls, lose one regular parking, have a more functional and aesthetically pleasing parking lot prior to regrading work.

The attached photos are the same image just zoomed in and out with the transformer relocation near the building from the middle of the parking lot.

I have asked Fire Chief Bierce about the transformer being located near the building and he confirmed that he has no concerns about this as long as WE Energies follows code requirements.
